New Kapanol TGA tick

SLOW-RELEASE morphine product Kapanol from Mayne Pharma has been given the Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA) nod for a new indication: treatment of chronic breathlessness in patients with advanced disease.

The Kapanol approval applies to low dose forms, 10mg and 20mg, and could improve the lives of more than 70,000 Australians, Mayne Pharma CEO Scott Richards said.

An application for this indication has been made to the PBAC for funding via the PBS.

EBOS forecasts FY20 growth

EBOS says it expects to increase its underlying earnings during the remainder of the current financial year, with further growth forecast into 2019/20 "as we commence servicing the Chemist Warehouse contract volumes".

The company released its first half results this morning (PD breaking news), which also confirmed the acquisition of the Qunitns headline business - among other key achievements including the signing of the Chemist Warehouse deal and the acquisition of all minority shares in Terry White Group.

Total revenue for the six months to 31 December was \$3.5 billion, down slightly due to the ongoing impact of PBS reforms and lower sales of hepatitis C medications.

The statutory net profit after tax was down about 3.7% to \$67 million, including the impact of \$8.8 million in costs relating to mergers & acquisitions, rationalising warehouse facilities and employee redundancy costs.

CEO John Cullity said EBOS was pleased with the recent government decision to maintain strict service standards and reporting obligations relating to the Community Service Obligation - and in particular the changes preventing distributors from undertaking new exclusive-direct arrangements

participating in the CSO.

"However falling medicine prices, rising operational costs across the industry and a failure to fully resolve the issue of equal access for the distribution of PBS medicines have had an impact on our performance," Cullity said.

The EBOS Consumer Products division saw revenue jump 9.6% mainly driven by a strong performance of the Red Seal range and sales from the recently acquired Gran's Remedy brand.

EBOS also announced an interim dividend of NZ\$34.5c per share, up 4.5% on the prior corresponding period.



API CAGR & ROE up

AUSTRALIAN Pharmaceutical Industries (API) has highlighted its FY18 ongoing upward trend of compound annual growth rate (CAGR) and return on equity (ROE) in its CEO Connect report.



The ASX announcement via powerpoint showed revenue of \$4.0 billion, underlying EBITDA of \$119 million, yielding 11.1c earnings per share and total dividends of 7.5c/share.

The future strength and stability was focused on evolving Priceline Pharmacy, expanding Clearskincare, building consumer brands and growing via the possible merger with Sigma.

Blackmores bumper first half report

AUSTRALIA'S largest complementary medicines company Blackmores has reported first half F19 revenue record of \$319 million, up 11%, despite China sales dropping 11% in the same period (PD breaking news yesterday).

Even so the company estimated that with China-influenced sales through Australian retailers included, sales to Chinese consumers were up around 8% in total for the half year.

The company also reported strong growth across other Asian markets: Korea +67%, Taiwan +150%, Hong Kong +39%, Indonesia +72% and other Asian segment revenue up 34% pcp to \$53 million.

Blackmores' Bioceuticals brand leads the practitioner-only category with revenue up 7%.

Overall net profit for the half year was \$34 million with EBIT profit up 268% in other Asian businesses.

CM doctors warned

DOCTORS prescribing alternative therapies have been warned against initiating treatment without a "reasonable expectation" of clinical benefit, under new guidelines from the Medical Board of Australia, reports AusDoc.

The Board called for new rules to be in play for doctors who work "outside mainstream medicine" to "protect patients against financial exploitation and unnecessary treatment" and to avoid financial conflicts of interest.
