Medicine shortages reporting up 400%

MEDICINES shortages are continuing to impact pharmacies across the country, with TACS (Technical And Customer Services) Healthcare Health Policy Specialists, Sharon Leadbitter, reporting a 400% increase in the number of new notifications to the Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA) in the 2018/19 year.

In an article posted on LinkedIn, Leadbitter noted 1,455 shortage notifications were made in 2018/19 compared to 274 in the 12 months prior.

Pharmacy Guild of Australian Victorian Branch President, Anthony Tassone, told *Pharmacy Daily* that medicines shortages have plagued the sector in recent years.

"Supply issues and medicine shortages have been an ongoing problem and frustration for many years, and the Guild welcomed working with the Government in



2017 and 2018, which resulted in bringing in stronger reporting requirements for manufacturers at the beginning of this year," he said.

"However, reporting alone does not resolve the problem and we believe there is still more that must be done.

"We'd like to see the Government work again with key stakeholders, including pharmacists, prescribers and consumers, to consider what further needs to be done to improve the situation.

"From a patient perspective,

medicine shortages can result in frequent brand changes, or paying higher prices if the only reliable supply has a brand price premium or is non-PBS listed or even worse – possibly risk going without.

"With the recent declaration by the Minister for Health, Greg Hunt and State and Territory Ministers at COAG that the 'Quality use of medicines and Medicines Safety' is a national health priority, the continuity and assurance of the supply chain is absolutely central and critical in helping achieve that."

MHR at 90% & 1.5b docs

DIGITAL Australian health records database My Health Record (MHR) now has records for 90% of the population and has a total of 1.5 billion documents in the system, according to the Australian Digital Health Agency (ADHA) 2018–19 Annual Report tabled in parliament.

The report covers the period 01 Jul 2018 to 30 Jun 2019.

ADHA CEO, Tim Kelsey said, "The 2018–19 Annual Report shows the Agency is making significant progress toward the key priorities set out in the National Digital Health Strategy, endorsed by all State and Territory Governments through the Council of Australian Government (COAG) Health Council".

Among the key achievements Kelsey highlighted was the development of a national framework, and new interoperability standards, to ensure health professionals can securely and quickly send patient information to one another without



using a fax machine.

The agency also released the Pharmacist Shared Medicines List (PSML) document type to further improve medicines safety, piggybacking on the success of the Medicines View document and its aggregation of all relevant medicines and allergy data in a single, real-time view, Kelsey added.

"We've made important strides in a range of other areas, such as supporting secure messaging and information exchange between healthcare providers."

Opioid agonists still best Rx

DESPITE the evidence supporting the use of opioid agonists such as methadone and buprenorphine to combat opioid dependence, the uptake is hindered by barriers, says Monash Addiction Research Centre A/Prof Suzanne Nielsen.

Last year, 1,123 people died from opioids, namely illicit drugs such as heroin, and pain relievers such as codeine, oxycodone and morphine.

Nielsen identifies four barriers to their use:

Cost - weekly average cost of scripts at pharmacy can add up to \$35-\$70 just based on dispensing fees.

Stigma - is still associated with their use.

Restrictiveness - there is still the need to attend a pharmacy daily for the therapy.

Access limitations - especially in rural and regional centres.
