Pharmacist osteoporosis role

PHARMACISTS will form one of the pillars of educational support for the 4.7 million Australians aged over 50 living with poor bone health, under a new National Strategic Action Plan launched by Osteoporosis Australia (OA) together with the Federal Minister for Health and Federal Minister for Aged Care and Senior Australians yesterday.

The first priority of the plan is to "increase osteoporosis awareness and education, with a focus on prevention".

To implement the plan, \$4 million has been allocated.

The plan calls for patients to take an active role in their health care, including "adherence to pharmaceutical treatment," with pharmacists also nominated as helping in the process of education.

No need for pharmacist Rx - RACGP

Pharmacists have rejected the RACGP's assertion that the Board's decision not to apply for an endorsement to enable them to prescribe autonomously was "effectively ruling out this model", with one pharmacist responding on Twitter saying, "that's not what this means at all".

While Nespolon's assertion that removing the Location Rules would improve access to medicines runs contrary to the findings of the Review of Pharmacy Remuneration and Regulation by Professor Stephen King, published in 2016, which noted there were inconsistencies in the location of pharmacies prior to the

introduction of the rules.

"[The 1988 Pharmaceutical Benefits Remuneration Tribunal] found that many pharmacies in urban areas were clustered together with rural and remote areas having significantly poorer access," he said.

"In some cases pharmacies were located within 10 metres of each other, 25% of pharmacies were within 100 metres of another pharmacy and 62% were within one kilometre of another pharmacy, while other areas struggled to attract even one."

King said the introduction of the Location Rules resulted in a restructuring of the sector that encouraged greater efficiency within the sector and led to the opening of pharmacies in areas of need.

Brits slam AMA Rx fears

CONCERNS about the potential introduction of pharmacist prescribing in Australia have little or no basis, a British pharmacist says.

Responding to the Australian Medical Association (AMA) Minimum Standards for Prescribing, which suggested pharmacist prescribing should be ruled out on the grounds it could put patients safety at risk, British Primary Care Pharmacy Association President, Graham Stretch, called on the AMA to produce evidence for the organisation's concerns.

"Prescribing by pharmacists is widespread and common in the UK," he said in a Twitter post.

"Studies I'm aware of demonstrate quite the opposite - pharmacists are safer [prescribers]."

Stretch linked to a study which found pharmacists had a lower error rate when prescribing than doctors and nurses.

University of Leeds Professor of Medicines Use and Safety, David Alldred, said the AMA's standards for



prescribing were "flying in the face of the evidence", citing a Cochrane review, of 46 studies, which found, " pharmacists and nurses...were able to deliver comparable prescribing outcomes to doctors".

Former Royal Pharmaceutical Society President, Steve Churton, joined the social media thread to question the AMA.

"Come on @amapresident (Dr Tony Bartone) and @ama_media... let's have your responses please," he said.

"[I] would genuinely be interested in your evidence to support your position."

AN ARMED robbery at a Brazilian pharmacy took an unexpected turn when one of the gun-toting bandits refused to take money from an elderly patron of the store.

The raid was caught on CCTV, and showed a pair of thieves sporting motorcycle helmets, hold-up a pharmacy in the city of Amarante.

During the robbery one of the duo ran through the pharmacy grabbing items from the shelves before ordering a staff member to empty the cash register, when the elderly woman approached his accomplice and presented her handbag, offering to hand over her money.

Instead of greedily taking the pensioner's cash, the pistol carrying thief said "no, ma'am, you can be quiet, I don't want your money," and patted the woman reassuringly on the shoulder, local media website, G1 reported.

When the old lady reached out to protest at the cashier being forced to the ground, the gentle thief put his hand on the retiree and kissed her on the forehead, before the pair escaped with about US\$240 and some products.
