#### PHARMACISTS can play a key

role in delivering first-line care to patients with lower-back pain (LBP), using a clinical decision support system (CDSS), Australian research reveals.

The study published in JMIR Medical Informatics, involved five pharmacists assessing five case vignettes each with the support of an iPad-based CDSS in assessing patients with LBP.

The authors noted that pharmacists appreciated guidance provided by the CDSS in relation to management, particularly for
