CWH in hospitals

CHEMIST Warehouse's new hospital pharmacy venture with Icon Group's Cathie Reid and Stuart Giles, announced today, is a "game changer", and could "have the potential to be the biggest thing we have done yet," say its key players, reported the Australian Financial Review.

A Chemist Warehouse spokesperson said, "the new partnership will allow the company to expand its operations & service to patients during and after hospital admissions, & produce employment opportunities for pharmacists and assistants".

'Dramatic rebuild' of PPS

THE Pharmaceutical Society of Australia's Professional Practice Standards (PPS) have undergone a "dramatic rebuild, making them more flexible to meet the diverse and contemporary needs of pharmacists practising in different specialty areas and scopes", (PD Breaking News Fri).

The National President Dr Fei Sim launched the updated PPS in her speech at the PSA23 conference, in front of pharmacists, organisation leaders, and government officials.

Under the new Standards, each clinical activity taken by pharmacists falls into one or more of 17 Standards that are built off the medicine management cycle.

"Applying the PPS to practice will require pharmacists to look at the clinical activities they undertake, and the minimum practice standards that apply to those activities," Sim said.

The PSA stated that the new competency framework is designed to provide a clear and consistent

approach to assessing the skills and knowledge of pharmacists, and includes 10 competency domains, such as patient-centred care, medication management, and professional practice.

With increasing use of telehealth services, the PPS aims to ensure that pharmacists are equipped to provide safe and effective care to patients through these services, with guidance on use of tech and patient privacy, revealed the PSA.

The PPS covers areas such as patient assessment, medication management, and communication with other healthcare providers.

They also provide guidance on the use of technology and the importance of maintaining patient privacy and confidentiality.

The updated Standards include new requirements for medication safety, which aim to reduce the risk of medication errors and ensure that patients receive the correct medication and dosage, the PSA explained.

Dispensary Corner

WITH the key bits anatomically correct, NZ's Wellington Regional Hospital's simulation patients, or Sims, are incredibly high tech...and undeniably creepy, revealed Stuff.

Since simulations began last month, pregnant Maia, and baby Anne has already trained more than 150 staff in the neonatal unit, "so all our staff are really familiar and comfortable with emergency management of fragile babies," neonatologist Dr Maria Saito-Benz said.

They're part of a major \$350,000 investment in Wellington Regional Hospital's simulation technology funded through the Wellington Hospitals Foundation.

Here are some of the craziest things Sims can do:

Breathe - their chest can rise and fall, they can have a breathing tube inserted, and the 27-week-old baby even has tiny, anatomically correct airways.

They can also be hooked up to hospital monitoring equipment.

Bleed - it's water and dye but is intended to help make the simulation more realistic.

Cry - pick up the baby and it will cry, as babies do.

Maia can also speak and share her distress during labour, and she can also swear.

Seizure - pregnant Maia can react to medication, go into cardiac arrest and be shocked, prompting emergency responses.

Blink - usually Maia can eyetrack and blink, to add to the realism.

MedAdvisor's cash growth

DIGITAL medication management company, MedAdvisor has reported a growth of 44.5% in its operating revenue for the fourth quarter year-to-date (Q4 YTD) ending on 30 Jun 2023.

The company's gross profit has also increased by 32.9%, and it has a strong cash position of \$14.2

MedAdvisor has achieved significant cost savings by reducing its headcount in Australia and attributes its success to its "innovative approach to medication management, which has gained popularity among patients and healthcare providers alike," an ASX company statement shared.

The company stated its digital platform allows patients to manage their medications, receive reminders, and communicate with their healthcare providers, thereby, improving medication adherence and reducing healthcare costs.

MedAdvisor's digital patient

communications have reached over 90 million, and the company has launched a number of digital pharma-sponsored US programs.

However, the company reported that its revenue for the Jun quarter was \$16.9 million, a decrease of 5.1% compared to the same period last year.

The decrease in revenue can be attributed to the seasonality of the US business and the timing of programs going live, according to the company.

Despite the decrease in revenue for the Jun quarter, MedAdvisor's growth in operating revenue for Q4 YTD demonstrated the company's commitment to innovation and its ability to meet the needs of patients and healthcare providers.

GuildLink pharmacy integration went well and with a strong cash position and a growing customer base, MedAdvisor shared it is wellpositioned for continued success in the future.

ASL elearning helps keep track of scripts

THE elearning module on the Australian Digital Health Agency's portal called *Electronic* Prescriptions and Active Script List (MySL) in community pharmacy has been updated to highlight the benefits for patients and pharmacies of using an Active Script List (ASL).

An ASL is a token management solution that contains a consolidated list of a patient's active electronic prescriptions.

It is a more convenient way for patients who take multiple medications to manage their prescriptions, as they no longer need to keep track of individual SMS or email tokens.

Patients need to register for an

ASL by visiting a pharmacy that is enabled to offer this service.

Instead of presenting a token, patients will confirm their identity and request the pharmacy dispense medicines from their ASL.

The course is CPD accredited with the Australian Pharmacy Council which provides a good opportunity for pharmacists to refresh their knowledge in electronic prescriptions and in particular ASL before the annual CPD cycle ends on 30 Sep.

The module is intended for dispensary assistants, pharmacy technicians, and interns who may be involved in the ASL registration process.


