Vic passes legislation

THE passage of legislation that enables the Victorian community pharmacist prescribing pilot has been welcomed by the state's Pharmacy Guild branch, which stated that this is an important step towards expanding the role of community pharmacists.

The amendments to the *Drugs, Poisons and Controlled Substances Act 1981* that were passed today by the Victorian Parliament creates the power to legally authorise pharmacists to supply certain prescription medicines to enable the 12-month pharmacist prescribing pilot, said the Guild.

This follows the 2023/24 Victorian State Budget allocation of \$20 million to support the delivery of the Andrews Labor Government's election commitment to a 12-month expanded scope of practice pilot for pharmacists.

Under the pharmacist prescribing pilot, appropriately trained community pharmacists will be able to reissue repeat prescriptions of oral contraceptives, treat minor skin conditions and provide antibiotics for the treatment of uncomplicated urinary tract infections (UTIs).

Pharmacist immunisers participating in the pharmacist prescribing pilot will also be authorised to administer select travel vaccines following the completion of additional training.

Victorian Pharmacy Guild Branch President Anthony Tassone said, "the community pharmacist prescribing pilot will allow community pharmacists to use

their clinical expertise to provide patients with timely and effective treatment for a selection of common health conditions".

"Authorising pharmacists to treat uncomplicated UTIs, skin conditions and issue repeat oral contraceptive prescriptions is a practical step that will help relieve the burden on our overstretched health system and ensure patients have access to the routine healthcare services they need," explained Tassone.

The Victorian pharmacist prescribing pilot would follow a successful UTI pilot in Queensland, which has seen pharmacist treatment of UTIs become a permanent program, and a NSW UTI pharmacy prescribing trial, which began in May.

To participate in the Victorian pharmacist prescribing pilot, community pharmacists will need to complete additional training and will be required to follow clear structured protocols and guidelines for prescribing the medicines, shared Tassone.

The Victorian pharmacist prescribing pilot program is due to commence from Oct this year.

The Pharmacy Guild stated it is among the expert advisory and clinical groups providing guidance to the Victorian gov't on the design and implementation of the pharmacist prescribing pilot.

Stand alone e-scripting tool invented

TELECARE has launched its first ever standalone platform in Australia for electronic prescriptions, known as RxPad, **HERE**.

It is built by clinicians for clinicians to replace the conventional methods of paper prescriptions.

According to Telecare's Chief Medical Officer, Dr Chris Sia, with this tool, "doctors no longer have to write up and send out paper prescriptions by snail mail to their patients, cutting down on wait times in obtaining medications from pharmacies".

RxPad will also replace the process of writing up, signing

off and posting out paper prescriptions by streamlining it as a digital work flow, therefore allowing doctors to have a better focus on patient care.

RxPad is compliant with the Australian Digital Health Agency guidelines, and is integrated with MIMS.

The integration aims to ensure that doctors have the latest drug information, minimising errors and ensuring accuracy in prescriptions.

RxPad claims to be costefficient, operating on a cloudbased, mobile-friendly platform without any need to log into any practice management software.

Dispensary Corner

RESEARCHERS analysed almost 700 TikToks uploaded by young people, tagged #Boomer or #OKBoomer, and found that half of the videos had negative stereotypes about older adults.

Videos criticising older adults' values/beliefs, or portraying negative encounters with them, were more likely to feature negative age stereotypes (such as those relating to their appearance, competence, or physical functioning).

Such videos often claim older people have old-fashioned views and are holding back

'Boomer-blaming' videos suggest older people have wrecked the economy, environment, or give examples of them behaving badly towards younger people.

On the other hand, videos portraying older adults as "warm" were 43% less likely to contain negative stereotypes.

Dr Reuben Ng, who led the study from the National University of Singapore, said,"portrayals of older adults in the 1900s were very positive, celebrating older adults as heroes and romantics.

"In the last 50 years, the view of ageing has changed dramatically, and ageism is rife on TikTok, with one in two videos created about older adults found to be disparaging."

Authors of the study say these results show the importance of exposing young people to counter-stereotypical depictions of older adults, and fostering intergenerational solidarity.

WA Premier to grow role

Liquid metal way

A LIQUID metal combination is shaping up as a potential secret weapon in the global fight against antimicrobial resistance, as shown HERE.

Scientists from the US and Australia led by Flinders University have developed a simple metallic coating treatment for bandages, medical devices and other surfaces which are capable of resisting and killing bacteria.

"Gallium in its liquid state (GaLM) is one of the most promising candidates to be used as an antimicrobial agent, and can be used in many ways as a liquid metal," said lead author Dr Vi Khanh Truong.

"The liquid state of GaLM is easily combined or functionalised with other components to create various forms of more efficient antimicrobial metals, and is compatible with human cells."

'Get dead set' day

DYING to Know Day, a national annual campaign that helps Australians live, grieve, and die better, is calling on the Australian Government to fund community-led approaches for end-of-life care.

A presentation at NSW Parliament House on Dying to Know Day next Tue 8 Aug will bring together experts and politicians to showcase new research that demonstrates community-led public health initiatives for end-of-life care.
