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Combat misinformation: FIP

PHARMACISTS should utilise their expertise to lead the "creation and execution of effective medicines information strategies, while establishing their role as a trusted partner and knowledge base for other healthcare practitioners as the primary resource for obtaining accurate and unbiased medicines information," according to a new policy statement from the International Pharmaceutical Federation (FIP).

The update replaces a previous document released in 2017, and takes into account the increasing use of digital information sources including artificial intelligence.

Boyan Todorov, President of FIP's Health and Medicines Information Section, also urged governments

around the world to regulate against medicines misinformation.

Todorov said the new policy puts "a stronger emphasis on the role of pharmacists to lead in this area".

"For example, users of medicines can now find information through artificial intelligence platforms, but that information can be incorrect, with detrimental effects on health.

"In particular, pharmacists should give special attention to the use of printed or electronic information to reinforce spoken information provided," Todorov added.

As part of the policy makeover FIP is calling for the establishment of medicines information centres operated by specialised pharmacists, with the full document available at fip.org. JG



Register for NMS now

PHARMACISTS and other industry stakeholders are being invited to register for the National Medicines Symposium (NMS) 2023, which is for the first time being hosted by the Australian Commission on Safety and Quality in Healthcare (ACSQH) (PD 05 Jul).

The event is scheduled to take place online online on Wed 08 Nov, focusing on the future of medicines and sustainability, with a range of experts, policymakers and thought leaders from around the world presenting "on how appropriate use of medicines can contribute to a sustainable healthcare system".

Attendees will gain an insight into the impact of pharmaceutical waste and the role of medicines in contributing to greenhouse gases, and be able to "join the conversation on fostering a culture of sustainability within healthcare, ensuring quality patient care while reducing waste".

"In Australia, health care contributes close to 7% of our nation's greenhouse gases, with medicines being one of the largest contributors," according to the Commission, which noted that pharmaceutical waste can lead to environmental human and animal toxicities." ASCQH said.

The full program for the event is now available, with high profile speakers including Professor Paul Kelly, Chief Medical Officer from the Department of Health and Aged Care; Dr Nick Watts, NHS England's Chief Sustainability Officer; and Dr Kate Charlesworth, Senior Advisor Climate Risk and Net Zero Unit at the NSW Ministry of Health.

Consultant pharmacist Tim Perry will appear in a panel discussion on "what can be done to drive more appropriate prescribing in practice" alongside GP Dr Brett Montgomery from the University of Western Australia and Alexandra Barratt, Professor of Public Health at the University of Sydney.

Grace Wong from Pharmacists from the Environment Australia is also on a panel, while community pharmacist and UTS Professor in Indigenous Health, Faye McMillan AM, will speak on approaches to sustainable medicines management in Aboriginal Controlled Community Health Organisations.

The pharmacy-led Return of Unwanted Medicines (RUM) project is also on the agenda courtesy of pharmacist Toni Riley. BP

Fake Ozempic

THE European Medicines Agency has alerted patients and healthcare professionals to reports about falsified Ozempic pens, which have been identified at wholesalers in the EU and the UK.

The pens are labelled in German and originated from Austria and Germany, with no evidence at this stage that they have been dispensed to patients from legal pharmacies.

Vancomycin not the answer

A CLINICAL trial, published today in the New England Journal of Medicine and led by Monash University researchers, has found that the addition of the antibiotic vancomycin after a knee surgery did not protect against infection and may have led to more infections and more adverse reactions for patients in Australia.

Current standard practice includes the administration of cefazolin at the time of surgery to prevent infection, however the rise in antibiotic resistant bacteria has led experts to consider adding a second antibiotic, such as vancomycin to prevent more infection.

Many centres in Australia and globally have adopted the practice of giving both cefazolin and vancomycin to prevent infections, despite the lack of clear benefits.

According to the study lead, Professor Trisha Peel, from the Monash University Central Clinical School, "given the number of joint replacements performed in Australia and globally, our trial has answered the important question about whether more antibiotics are better for our patients having joint replacement surgery.

"The definitive answer is 'no'," she said.

The Australian Surgical Antibiotic Prophylaxis trial looked at 4,239 patients without a MRSA history, in 11 hospitals, including regional and private hospitals in the country, finding the addition of vancomycin was no better than just using cefazolin.
