PSA calls to cut red tape for vax services

THE Pharmaceutical Society of Australia (PSA) is advocating for the removal of vaccination red tape and the harmonisation of pharmacist immunisation regulations.

The PSA argues that the Australian Immunisation Handbook should be adopted as the national standard for vaccine formularies, allowing pharmacists in every region to offer the same vaccines.

"Pharmacists are underutilised in many states and territories, with regulatory barriers preventing them from practicing to their full potential when providing vaccination services," said PSA National President, A/Prof Fei Sim.

The PSA believes that national harmonisation would not only improve access but also help achieve immunisation targets.

The recent approval of the Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV) vaccine further underscores the

SUBSIDY applications are now open for pharmacists in Queensland participating in the Community Pharmacy Scope of Practice Pilot.

Managed by the Australasian College of Pharmacy, the subsidies are part of a \$6 million govt initiative announced in Jun to support the Pilot's statewide rollout.

Eligible pharmacists can receive up to \$7,000 for completing various approved training courses within 18 months of enrolment.

importance of uniform access. While available in some regions, residents of South Australia, Western Australia, and the Northern Territory do not yet have access to the RSV vaccine at local pharmacies, unlike other states.

"Leveraging the accessibility of pharmacists to administer a greater range of vaccines would hugely improve uptake and reduce hospitalisations from vaccinepreventable diseases," Sim added.

The PSA's *Pharmacists in 2030* outlines a roadmap for the future

of the profession, focusing on maximising pharmacists' potential to improve healthcare access. Removing regulatory barriers is seen as a crucial first step.

Sim also urged pharmacists to use PSA resources, such as the Respiratory Syncytial Virus module, to stay updated on vaccination services as the Continuing Professional Development cycle ends on 30 Sep. JG

NSW UTI service listings need updating

PHARMACIES in New South Wales providing urinary tract infection (UTI) services are now required to maintain an updated listing on the National Health Services Directory (NHSD), in line with requirements.

Insurer Pharmaceutical Defence Limited (PDL) stated that pharmacies should verify their UTI service listing by using the NHSD Service Finder, selecting 'pharmacy' and filtering by 'urinary tract infection treatment'. If a pharmacy appears on the map after searching, it is already



compliant, stated PDL.

However, if a pharmacy is listed but does not show under UTI services, it must update its listing by contacting the NHSD team at nhsd@healthdirect.org.au.

PDL has informed that if a pharmacy is not listed at all, it needs to register with the NHSD via the online form found **HERE**, specifying UTI treatment as a service - to see more, **CLICK HERE**.

Ego celebrates eco win



EGO Pharmaceuticals won a Silver medal at the 2024 Australasian Packaging Innovation & Design (PIDA) Awards last week, in recognition of its recent sustainable packaging redesign for the QV Face range.

The renewed packaging, which earned accolades in the Sustainable Packaging Design category, underscores Ego's commitment to minimising environmental impact.

The revamp resulted in an uptick in the percentage of recyclable packaging from 50.2% to 74.5%, while the overall packaging weight was reduced by 14%.

Around 13 tonnes of packaging will be diverted from landfill each year based on the volume of QV Face products delivered to the Australian market in FY 22/23.

Ego is a signatory of the Australian Packaging Covenant and a member of the Australia, NZ, and Pacific Island Pact on Plastic.

Dispensary Corner

SENSITIVITY to various forms of artificial light can play a role in the treatment of insomnia, but a cool new device from Monash University may be ready to help sufferers get some muchneeded shuteye.

Researchers at the Melbourne institution have developed a new wearable device which records the impact artificial light has on disrupting sound sleep.

The device, known as MiEye, is about the size of a 20-cent piece and is connected to a smartphone app to record the impact of any light source, such as fluorescent light, overhead LED, and device light.

Researchers believe the device can come in handy for travellers subjected to jet lag when they cross time zones, and shift workers whose body clocks are in a constant state of flux.

The device sends data on sleep disruption to the app, which calculates the impact on the user, which in turn can help fine tune insomnia treatment.

"By helping to manage circadian rhythms, MiEye will be a powerful clinical tool that can aid in the treatment of type 2 diabetes, mental health issues, cardiovascular disease and hypertension, and generally improve health and longevity," said lead study author, Professor Sean Cain.

Researchers have adapted the device for commercial production through a spinoff company called Circadian Health Innovations, with the device expected to be available for more sleep research in 2025.





A NEW report from the Bureau of Health Information (BHI) reveals that patient experiences in NSW hospitals improved between 2022 and 2023, despite increasing pressures on the healthcare system.

BHI Chief Executive Dr Diane Watson stated that the latest Adult Admitted Patient Survey indicated a generally positive outlook on hospital care among patients.

Of the over 20,000 NSW patients surveyed, 92% rated their overall care in 2023 as either "very good" or "good", with 68% of patients rating it as "very good", an increase from 66% in 2022.

Dr Watson credited these hospital improvements to the dedication of various health

professionals across the state. The survey showed better ratings in more than half of the questions

compared to the previous year. Notably, 66% of patients rated the teamwork of health professionals as "very good", up from 63% in 2022.

Additionally, 69% of patients felt they had sufficient time to discuss their health concerns, and 74% reported that their families received the right amount of information about their condition, both showing improvements.

The report also highlights differences between urban and rural hospitals.

Patients in rural hospitals reported significantly more positive experiences overall, while urban hospitals scored higher only in providing discharge summaries.

The report also focused on Aboriginal patients, with 77% feeling they were always treated with respect, though only 29% received support from an Aboriginal health worker.

Dr Watson highlighted the importance of access to Aboriginal health workers, as 94% of those who received such support felt more comfortable with their care. JG

Raise awareness about mpox vaccines

PHARMACISTS are urged to raise awareness about the free mpox vaccine available for eligible at-risk people through their local pharmacies.

The vaccine is also widely available through sexual health clinics, hospitals, general practitioners, Aboriginal health services and councils.

Victoria's Chief Health Officer said there is an ongoing outbreak of mpox in the state, and other

Australian jurisdictions, mostly impacting gay and bisexual men. This outbreak is caused by the Clade IIb strain of the virus.

There is a rapidly increasing mpox outbreak within central and eastern Africa caused by Clade Ib of the virus, which is not detected in Australia to date. The World Health Organization

has declared the outbreak a public health emergency of international concern.

Conference hype

REGISTRATIONS are closing soon for the 2024 Pharmacy **Connect and Pharmacy** Assistant National Conference, taking place from 05-07 Sep at Hyatt Regency Sydney.

Hosted by the Pharmacy Guild of Australia and Pharmacy Connect, the must-attend events will be an opportunity to hear industry updates, gain business advice and network with peers.

Shaping the conference program in 2024 are key issues surrounding the government's 60-day PBS supply policy.

Sessions will be held on the **Eighth Community Pharmacy** Agreement, which began earlier this year, with a focus on transitional issues faced by community pharmacies.

The event will also feature the Student Summit, returning this year by popular demand and again providing invaluable opportunities for pharmacy students and interns to meet with potential employers and attend informative workshops.

Last year, more than 1,300 pharmacists and assistants attended the two conferences.

Pharmacy Guild of Australia National President, Prof Trent Twomey, said he was excited for the major event.

"I'm looking forward to catching up with each and every one of you, the pharmacists and pharmacy assistants of Australia, to talk not just about the 8CPA but all of the Full Scope of Practice initiatives that are coming online in all the states and territories," he said.
