#### Right to disconnect

FROM today, the right to disconnect will take effect for pharmacists and other workers employed by a business with less than 15 employees.

Part of the landmark Closing Loopholes Bill, the new right gives an employee a right to refuse to respond to contact from their employer outside of work hours, unless the contact is deemed to be considered 'reasonable'.

The Pharmacy Programs Administrator has asked business owners not to contact employee pharmacists out of hours to solve clinical or business issues, and have contingency plans in place.

#### Govt slammed for no national RSV program

**THE** Immunisation Foundation of Australia has raised concerns that vulnerable people may miss out on protection from the Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV).

Despite global efforts to embrace new RSV immunisations, the Federal Government has not added any RSV immunisations to the National Immunisation Program. Countries in the Northern Hemisphere are preparing for winter with comprehensive immunisation programs.

**Director Catherine Hughes** stressed the urgent need for a national program.

"The success of RSV immunisation programs internationally, and now in Queensland and Western Australia, provides compelling evidence that we can dramatically reduce the number of babies admitted to hospital each winter".

With increases in global demand for the vaccines as programs ramp up, Hughes also warned that "we cannot risk further delays".

#### **Biologics' insights**



PHARMACY Connect 2024 will feature a session on the complex patient journey to biologic therapy, which is known to involve multiple failed treatments and extensive diagnostics.

# BLS' cannabis 'gummies'

THE Mediterranean Diet, famous for its olive oil, fresh

veggies, and a splash of red wine, might be doing more for you than just keeping your taste buds happy.

A study in *PLOS ONE* suggests it could help fend off COVID-19.

Yes, while you're savouring that green salad with feta and olives you might also be giving your immune system a boost.

A new review of six studies involving over 55,000 people looked into whether this diet has any effect on COVID-19 risk, symptoms, and severity.

The results are mixed, but certainly promising.

Four studies found that sticking to the Mediterranean Diet might lower your chances of catching COVID-19.


Another study linked the healthy diet to fewer symptoms, and another suggested it could reduce the severity of the illness.

However, not all the studies were enthusiastic - some didn't find significant benefits, and the reliance on self-reported food questionnaires might have skewed results.

After all, who doesn't overestimate their daily servings of vegetables?

In the end, while it's not a magic cure, the Mediterranean Diet seems to offer some protective perks against the COVID-19 virus.

So, if you're looking to enjoy more olive oil and fish, it might inspire you more knowing it's a delicious way to boost your immunity too.



The company stated the 'gummies' were produced under the Good Manufacturing Practice certification from the TGA, marking a step forward in the domestic medicinal cannabis market.

The gummies contain cannabidiol and/or delta-9tetrahydrocannabinol.

BLS started receiving its first commercial orders last month for the Aussie-made cannabis edibles, totalling approximately \$2 million.

To meet the growing demand, BLS is scaling up its production capacity from two million to six million single doses per month.

Further solidifying its position in the market, BLS has signed a two-year manufacturing and supply agreement with one of Australia's largest cannabis companies.

The deal is expected to generate at least \$28 million over its term.

Data shows the prescription cannabis edibles market in Australia is poised for substantial growth, and is projected to increase substantially from 1% of the \$500 million annual market in 2023 to



over 20% by 2030, representing a \$150 million opportunity.

Bioxyne is strategically positioning itself as a supplier of alternative pharmaceutical products, including cannabis, psilocybin, and MDMA, catering to both domestic and international markets.

Sam Watson, founder and CEO of BLS and MD of Bioxyne, and Jason Stephens, General Manager of BLS Australia, both highlighted the significance of the achievement, emphasising BLS' role in the rapidly growing Australian medical cannabis industry. JG

#### Potential new drug target found for T2D

AN INTERNATIONAL research team led by Monash University has uncovered a new mechanism by which metabolic diseases such as obesity, fatty liver disease, and type 2 diabetes (T2D) may be triggered.

The study, published in *Science Advances*, identified that a toxic lipid called C16 ceramide is produced in the gut in response to high-fat diets and then transported via the lymphatic system to other organs. C16 ceramide has been linked to metabolic diseases and is now

considered a key biomarker. Dr Sarah Turpin-Nolan from the Monash Institute of Pharmaceutical Sciences emphasised the significance of this finding, as it offers a potential new target for drug development aimed at blocking the lipid before it can leave the gut and cause harm.

#### New RACGP head

DR MICHAEL Wright has been named the new President of the Royal Australian College of GPs (RACGP).

He will assume the role at the RACGP's Annual General Meeting on 21 Nov, succeeding Dr Nicole Higgins, whose twoyear term concludes.

Dr Wright (**pictured**) brings a wealth of experience, having worked as a GP in Australia and England, owned a practice, and earned a PhD in health economics in 2019.

He has held significant roles within the RACGP, including Chair of the Expert Committee for Funding and Health System Reform and Deputy Chair of the NSW/ACT Faculty Council.

"I'm well aware that I'm taking on the role of RACGP President at a time when Australia's health system faces significant challenges, and fair and equitable access to general practice care is under threat," said Dr Wright.

"I will fight to make sure high-quality GP care remains accessible and affordable for all Australians, and that the value of GPs and general practice is understood and acknowledged by our policymakers as much as it is by our patients," he concluded.
