### **New PSS award**

**THE** Pharmacists' Support Service (PSS) announced the John Coppock Pharmacist Wellbeing Award in honour of pharmacy stalwart Coppock's significant contribution to the wellbeing of pharmacists.

To be given out every Oct, during Mental Health Month, the wellbeing award is sponsored by Pharmaceutical Defence Limited.

**PSS President Curtis Ruhnau** thanked both Coppock and his wife Lyn (pictured), and said, "there comes a time in life when we hope that we have left our profession in a better state than we found it".

"For John Coppock, there can be no doubt that he's done exactly this with Lyn's support."



**NORWOOD** National Pharmacies is the first community pharmacy to open its doors 24/7 under a South Australian Govt initiative to increase access to healthcare.

The National Pharmacies store in Norwood is now operating 24 hours a day after its official opening by National Pharmacies CEO Vito Borrello, Premier Peter Malinauskas, and Health and Wellbeing Minister Chris Picton.

Norwood National Pharmacies will service central Adelaide and is the first of three community pharmacies to open round-theclock under the initiative.

The State Govt has invested \$2.5 million a year to fund the initiative which will help to reduce avoidable presentations to busy hospital emergency departments.

Acknowledging the State Govt for improving access to many community pharmacy services, Borrello said "Norwood National Pharmacies is leading the way in providing Adelaide families and individuals an immediate gateway to manage personal health and wellbeing every hour of every day, while also benefiting the wider health network".

"Our professional team of pharmacists are now available 24/7 to provide health advice and dispense time-critical medications, including pain relief for sick children and antivirals for COVID and shingles, allowing for rapid treatment and recovery of illnesses that require prompt management." Premier Malinauskas commented

that this initiative is "a gamechanger for South Australian

families and will also relieve pressure on our busy hospitals". "If someone gets sick in the

middle of the night and needs guick access to medicine or health advice, they can now go to a 24hour pharmacy instead of the ED." Minister Picton added the

introduction of improved access to uncomplicated urinary tract infections (UTIs) treatment and a resupply of the contraceptive pill will also provide a "major boost" to women's healthcare, putting patients first and providing "faster access to support", while helping to ease pressure on hospital emergency departments and wait times to see a GP.

From next month, South Australian women aged 18-65 with UTIs will be able to access antibiotic treatment through participating community pharmacies.

And from May this year, eligible women will also be able to visit a local pharmacy to access a resupply of their oral contraceptive pill, without needing a doctor's appointment or prescription. JG

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# Gender sensitive training

A NEW training program is aiming to restore the balance after research revealed that transgender and gender diverse (TGD) people experience unequal treatment in some pharmacy settings.

James Cook University has designed a training program to address the knowledge gap and help equip pharmacists with tools to communicate with TGD customers in non-judgemental and inclusive ways.

PhD candidate Swapna Chaudhary, supervised by Prof Beverley Glass and A/Prof Robin Ray, considered the experience of pharmacists specifically trained in dealing with TGD clients.

She said it's estimated that between 0.1% and 2% of the global population identifies as TGD.

"Challenges faced by TGD people in healthcare settings, including community pharmacy, are widely recognised.

"Even though pharmacies provide various pharmaceutical services to TGD people, many report encountering several obstacles to receiving competent care," explained Chaudhary.

The university's research findings confirmed that pharmacists' awareness and knowledge about



TGD healthcare significantly improved after completing the training program.

"After three months the impact of training on pharmacists' practice was examined and most found the training program valuable and relevant, with noticeable changes in their knowledge levels and attitude," commented Chaudhary.

"Interestingly, the most noticeable change in the attitudes reported by pharmacists was their perspective of how they view not only TGD people, but everyone.

"This training program enabled pharmacists to be introspective and observe their own attitudes, behaviours, and practices."

However, she said that the skills learned are perishable.

"Providing training at regular intervals, summary communications, and printed materials, including new updates in gender-affirming therapies, may be necessary for pharmacists to retain the knowledge and skills learned." JG

# Tough times app

**THE** Australian Suicide **Prevention Foundation has** released the 'Prevent A Suicide: What to Say' app.

The app gives medicallyapproved messages which in effect give concerned individuals and the community a safety net to convey to anyone close to them who mentions suicide.

Founder Clinical Associate Professor David Horgan said, "the person's safety can become a shared effort involving both the community and health professionals".

Horgan said 40% of people will have contact at some time in life with a person who has attempted suicide.

Suicidal ideas are due to emotional pain and may be brief or go on for weeks or longer, with one in six Australians having had suicidal thoughts in their lives (ABS).

"Establishing a connection using our messages on the app with a family member, friend, or workmate to let them know you are there to help them can save their life," said Horgen. The app needs no training or

signups to ensure privacy.
