## EBOS surges ahead

EBOS Group's healthcare segment demonstrated robust performance in the first half of 2024, with revenue reaching \$6.3 billion and EBITDA hitting \$275.5 million, marking increases of 7.5% and 8.0%, respectively.

In Australia, healthcare revenue rose to \$5 billion, with underlying EBITDA increasing to \$228.6 million, driven by market leadership and margin management.

New Zealand and Southeast Asia saw healthcare revenue grow to \$1.3 billion, while underlying EBITDA slightly decreased to \$46.8 million due to COVID-19-related factors.

Community pharmacy revenue surged by \$181.0 million, with notable growth in retail brands like TerryWhite Chemmart and increased wholesale market share.

Excluding revenue from COVID-19-related anti-viral medications, community pharmacy delivered normalised revenue of 8.3%. Institutional healthcare revenue also saw a significant uptick, driven by Symbion Hospitals and Medical Technology businesses.

Revenue increased by \$205.8 million up 11.7% and gross operating revenue increased by \$11.7 million up 6%.

These results underscore EBOS' strong position and growth potential in the healthcare sector.

# Territory to recycle waste Dispensary

THE Northern Territory pharmacy group, Territory Pharmacy, has launched its first free, state-wide blister packs recycling program, in partnership with the recycling company TerraCycle.

Across the Northern Territory, it is estimated that around 60% of the general population has kerbside collection services.

The pharmacy group stated that the majority of regional and remote communities "do not have access to any municipal waste collection", with blister packs sent to landfills as they cannot be recycled, due to the complex nature of their composition.

As part of this new program, 12 pharmacies and two regional health clinics across the Northern Territory will operate as drop-off points.

Territorians can leave their empty blister and medication packs for



recycling in collection boxes. The program will soon be expanded to include 60 remote health clinics.

Territory Pharmacy's CEO and registered pharmacist Steven Kong said, "the launch of the program will signify a significant step in providing free recycling opportunities for hard-to-recycle waste in remote regions".

"By establishing collection points at pharmacies and regional clinics across the Territory, this free program will change recycling accessibility for communities that are underserved when it comes to local recycling options." JG

# Skin care course

THE Australasian College of Pharmacy's just-launched Skin Conditions Course will upskill community pharmacists in Vic on the management of two topical conditions (PD 20 Feb).

On completion of the Skin Conditions Course, which includes training on both mild plaque psoriasis and herpes zoster (shingles), Victorian pharmacists participating in the state's Community Pharmacist State-wide Pilot will be equipped to conduct standardised and structured assessments for patients.

College Members and Guild Proprietor Members can enrol for free while non-members can enrol for \$120.
