QUEENSLAND pharmacists can now enrol in the Sexual and Reproductive Health Contraceptive Service training program, launched yesterday by the Pharmaceutical Society of Australia (PSA). The initiative is part of the

Queensland Community Pharmacy Hormonal Contraception Pilot.

Upon completing the course, pharmacists will be able to autonomously prescribe hormonal contraception for eligible women aged 16 years and older.

The PSA's training program incorporates advanced machine technology, allowing pharmacists to engage with virtual patients in simulated consultations, thereby enhancing their confidence and competence in prescribing. Kerri Barwick, PSA General

Kerri Barwick, PSA General Manager for Education and Training, emphasised the significance of this initiative.

"This new training is a crucial step in supporting pharmacists' roles in reproductive health," she said. "It ensures more accessible care for Queensland women, providing safe and effective contraception when and where it's needed."

Barwick added, "PSA's training program is one of the first to utilise artificial intelligence, giving pharmacists the opportunity to test their skills in a simulated clinical environment.

"We're excited to continue to innovate on how we deliver nation-leading education to Australian pharmacists."

She also highlighted the ongoing collaboration with the state government, commenting, "PSA continues to work closely with the Queensland Government to deliver training and education to pharmacists as part of the state's community pharmacy pilots".

## BrainTrack installs surge

BRAINTRACK, a free app designed to support brain health, has achieved over 100,000 downloads worldwide since its release in Oct 2022.

Available in 202 countries. including Australia, India, and the United States. BrainTrack has garnered widespread acclaim for its approach to cognitive monitoring.

Developed by Dementia Australia, BrainTrack allows users to track potential cognitive changes over time through engaging, travel--themed games adapted from validated cognitive tests, and share the results with their doctors.

Dr Kaele Stokes, Dementia Australia's Executive Director of Services, Advocacy, and Research, highlighted the app's significance.

With over 421,000 Aussies living with dementia, projected to rise to 812,500 by 2054, brain health and

### Sugar tax slashes daily intake in the UK

FOLLOWING the introduction of the UK's Soft Drinks Industry Levy, also known as the sugar tax, daily sugar intake fell by about 5g in children and 11g in adults within a year, according to a study in the Journal of Epidemiology & Community Health.

The research, analysing 11 years of survey data, highlights the levy's effectiveness in reducing sugar consumption.

The study showed that over half of the reduction in sugar intake came from soft drinks.

Despite this progress, overall daily sugar intake still exceeds the World Health Organization's

early diagnosis are crucial.

recommended levels of 5% of total energy intake. Researchers noted that

sugar-sweetened beverages significantly contribute to health risks like weight gain, type 2 diabetes, and heart disease.

Post-levy, sugar intake from soft drinks halved in children and dropped by a third in adults.

The findings indicate that the sugar tax successfully lowered its consumption without prompting significant dietary substitutions.

This underscores the potential impact of public health policies on improving dietary habits and reducing sugar intake.



### Phage surprise finding to fight bacteria

A RECENT study has uncovered that a protein used by phages, viruses that infect bacteria, can bind both DNA and RNA.

This dual binding ability marks an advancement in understanding how phages can be used as alternatives to antibiotics both in human health and agriculture.

An international team, led by Prof Peter Fineran from the University of Otago, investigated this protein known for its DNAbinding capability and discovered its RNA-binding function.

This finding, published in Nature, enhances knowledge of phage-bacteria interactions. which is crucial for developing phage-based antimicrobials, explained Fineran.

Lead author Dr Nils Birkholz explained that understanding these interactions helps identify appropriate phages to combat

bacterial pathogens.

The study highlighted that the helix-turn-helix domain in the phage protein, typically associated with DNA binding, also binds RNA transcripts, adding a new layer of regulation to the production of anti-CRISPRs, which phages use to block bacterial defences.

"This unexpected discovery shows a novel regulatory mechanism in a well-studied protein family," explained Professor Fineran.

"It could significantly impact our understanding of gene regulation and the use of phages in various applications."

The findings promise to advance phage therapy, offering a potential alternative to traditional antibiotics and contributing to the global fight against antibiotic-resistant bacteria (**PD** 05 Jun).

WHAT do you get if you stick 40 hormonal teenagers with varying levels of social anxiety in an MRI scanner?

As a team of Dutch and Italian researchers have found, you get an interesting case study in emotional arousal.

The outcome was some curious data on how blushing cheeks can give away your emotions, with embarrassment top of the list.

To reach its outcome, researchers made the 40 teens watch pre-recorded videos of themselves and other people singing karaoke, with their brain and cheek temperatures measured at the same time.

As control stimuli, the video session involved watching themselves sing a song, followed by another person of similar singing ability, before the ultimate reality check as a professional singer performed.

Participants tended to blush more when they watched themselves singing, compared to watching others, with the blushing linked to higher activation in the cerebellum and the left paracentral lobe parts of the brain that control emotional arousal.

Armed with the results, researchers theorised the higher levels of blushing stemmed from a desire to flee but also a want not to give up the social connection karaoke brings.

Charles Darwin said blushing was "the most human of all expressions" and a clear indication of heightened selfawareness - right again, Darwin.

### \$6.9m to avian flu defence

THE risk of H5N1 reaching Australia is increasing, though we remain the only continent free from the H5N1 strain of avian flu, despite recent outbreaks of the H7 variant in Victoria, NSW, and the ACT, The Australian reported.

In response to the southern migration of birds in spring to Australia, surveillance of chicken farms and wild bird populations is going to be increased by the Federal Government.

The H5N1 variant has been causing mass deaths among poultry and wild birds overseas and has spread to humans and dairy cows, raising pandemic fears.

In response, the government has announced a \$6.9 million investment for early detection and prevention measures against both H5 and H7 strains.

The funding will also support the exploration of commercial avian influenza vaccines for Australia.

"The strength of our national biosecurity system and Australia's geographic isolation has kept us free from H5 High Pathogenicity Avian Influenza (HPAI)," said Agriculture Minister Murray Watt.

"But with migratory birds coming from areas where H5 HPAI is present, particularly as spring approaches, we face a constant risk beyond our control.

"Our investment in enhanced capability to detect and respond to avian influenza in wildlife is crucial." Michael Ward, Chair of Veterinary Public Health and Food Safety at the Sydney School of Veterinary Science, emphasised that the southern migration of birds along the Eastern Asian Flyway and the northerly migration from Antarctica, where the virus is spreading among seabirds,

heighten the risk of H5N1 reaching



Australian shores.

To date, around 1.8 million chickens have been culled in Australia due to the H7 virus. leading to egg shortages.

The H5N1 strain poses a significant concern due to its potential for human transmission.

Since 2003, there have been 891 human infections globally, resulting in 463 deaths, according to the World Health Organization.

Countries like the US and some European nations have already signed up to procure bird flu vaccines for humans. JG

### **COVID & diabetes**

A RECENT study published in JAMA reveals that COVID-19 infection may accelerate the progression of presymptomatic type 1 diabetes in children.

**Researchers tracked 509** children with presymptomatic type 1 diabetes from Feb 2015 to Oct 2023.

They found that the incidence rate of clinical diabetes was significantly higher during the pandemic (12.1 per 100 person-years) compared to the prepandemic period (6.4 per 100 person-years).

The study also noted that children who contracted COVID-19 had an even higher incidence rate of type 1 diabetes (14.0 per 100 personyears) compared to those who did not.

These findings suggest that COVID-19 infection could speed up the onset of clinical diabetes symptoms in susceptible children.

Further research is needed to confirm these results and explore the impact on adults. To learn more, CLICK HERE.
