\$10k to boost Tas hospital pharmacists

A NEW initiative to support hospital pharmacists in Tasmania was recently announced by the state's Health Minister, Guy Barnett.

A \$10,000 per annum market allowance has been approved for all pharmacists employed across the Tasmanian Health Service including in the Statewide Hospital Pharmacy, in accordance with the Allied Health **Professionals Public Sector Unions** Wages Agreement 2022.

"We highly value the important work that pharmacists perform in our hospital system, and their vital role in supporting patient care and safety, which is why we are acting to attract more," Barnett said.

"The introduction is designed to assist with boosting recruitment and retention for pharmacists in our hospitals," he added.

"We anticipate this will help to



fill current vacancies and boost the workforce, enabling us to enhance the pharmacy services provided in our hospitals and help meet the demand for new initiatives, such as Hospital in the Home."

The Pharmaceutical Society of Australia's Tasmania branch President David Peachey stressed the importance of adequate staffing in public hospitals for improving patient care.

"Enhancing our hospital pharmacist workforce and ensuring they are well-supported is crucial for implementing the recommendations from the 2023 Tasmanian Pharmacist Scope of Practice Review," said Peachey.

Peachey pointed out the need for a health system that recognises the role of hospital pharmacists and allows them to practice at their highest capacity, including through partnered pharmacist medication charting.

"We still have work to do to fully utilise the skills of pharmacists across our health system, but a strong workforce is essential for delivering the full benefits of our practice," he noted.

Tasmania's new market allowance will be effective from 01 Jul this vear. JG

FLUORESCENT hospital lights, a post-op patient under observation, and a medical team waiting anxiously to sign off a successful procedure.

But something's gone missing, and nobody can leave the room until it's found.

No, this isn't the latest medical drama on TV.

It's an ingenious escape room experience created by health experts at the University of South Australia (UniSA).

The immersive adventure, aptly named 'Escape from the Operating Room', transforms the everyday stress of accounting for surgical items into a fun learning game for postgrad perioperative nurses.

In a typical escape room, players solve puzzles to break free within a set time.

UniSA's version, set in a real operating room, challenges nursing students to work together, solve six puzzles related to perioperative nursing, and escape within 45 minutes.

The game aligns with the standards of the Australian College of Perioperative Nurses.

Dr Michelle Freeling, the mastermind behind the escape room and a nursing lecturer at UniSA, highlights its benefits.

"Healthcare environments are stressful; our escape room simulates high-pressure situations, allowing students to practice under stress but in a safe, low-stakes conditions."

The hands-on approach helps students apply their online lessons in real-world scenarios, boosting their competence.

Viatris' new dynamic portal

EOI for remuneration survey closing soon!
