# Healthy future for Sigma

**SIGMA** Healthcare Limited has reported a 45.7% jump in statutory net revenues to \$4.8 billion for the year-ending 31 Jan (*PD* breaking news) along with a non-recurring after-tax loss due to its merger with Chemist Warehouse Group (CWH).

The now-complete merger will see Sigma's next financial results report, which will reflect the period ending 30 Jun 2025, incorporate the first full-year's results from Chemist Warehouse and Sigma's performance from 12 Feb to 30 Jun.

Sigma incurred \$43.5 million in transaction, advisory and other costs relating to its CWH merger efforts along with \$2.8 million in onboarding costs relating to its new CWH supply contract.

The company reported a statutory EBITDA of \$47.5 million, down 7.9% on last year, along with an after-tax net loss of \$13.8 million, which factored in all merger expenses.

Sigma CEO and Managing Director Vikesh Ramsunder said the company's "laser focus" strategy to build scale, drive efficiencies, simplify the business and enhance margins had materially enhanced its operational performance.

Highlights for the full-year included the successful onboarding of the CWH supply contract, a new five-year wholesale industry agreement to sustain distribution of medicines throughout Australia and an 8.5% like-for-like wholesale sales growth across its Amcal and Discount Drug Stores brands.

"During this period, I was particularly proud of how we maintained our high standards of delivering and meeting the needs of all our customers despite the increase in volume which followed the onboarding of the new Chemist Warehouse supply contract and the significant management time that was dedicated to the merger," Ramsunder added.

The company said on this occasion, no dividend would be paid on account of the results. *ML*More from Sigma on page three.


This year, eligibility for the grant has been extended to pharmacy students to unlock a potential opportunity to foster their ongoing career growth.

## Labor caps co-payments

**EFFORTS** to make medicine more affordable for Australians are paying off, with the government pledging to cap co-payments on PBS-listed prescriptions at \$25 if it is re-elected this year (PD breaking news).

The \$6.60 co-payment reduction was formally announced this morning at the opening of the Australian Pharmacy Professional (APP) Conference on the Gold Coast.

"This will keep people healthier and prevent serious complications resulting from patients not taking their essential medicine." said Pharmacy Guild of Australia President, Trent Twomey.

For Australians holding a health or concession card, their medicines co-payment will remain frozen at \$7.70 until at least 2030.

The lower price will come into effect in Jan 2026 if the government is re-elected, with prices to then rise annually based on indexation.

Federal Health Minister Mark Butler said the last time Australians paid no more than \$25 for a PBS medicine was over 20 years ago.



"Cheaper medicines are good for the hip pocket and good for your health," Minister Butler said.

The lower co-payment cap will be formally announced in next week's federal budget and is expected to cost the government \$689 million.

Opening APP today, Twomey said reducing the co-payment is five times more effective than increasing dispense qualities.

"If your Guild and your government had not acted at the last election, the general co-payment would have reached \$50 by the first of January 2026," Twomen said.

"Reducing the co-payment is the most popular cost-of-living initiative of this government - it was so good they agreed to do it again." ML/KB

#### Price cut praised

THE Consumers Health Forum of Australia (CHF) has praised the government's move to cap the PBS co-payment at \$25 (PD breaking news).

CHF Chief Executive Elizabeth Deveny said the long-called-for step would bring meaningful relief to millions of Australians.

"Helping Australians better afford their medicine provides people with dignity and provides better health outcomes including preventing avoidable hospital admissions it benefits the entire system."

Work is still needed to improve the overall PBS system, Dr Deveny said, adding that automating the safety net scheme is the next objective.

"The PBS is complex and most people don't realise there are multiple payment tiers based on personal circumstance," Dr Deveny said, with many eligible Australians missing out on savings.

### Dispensary Corner

**ONE** 19-year-old woman in the UK has been left traumatised after finding out the hard way that jawbreaker lollies have their name for a reason - they can actually break your jaw.

Javeria Wasim recently bought a three-inch candy and because she could not wait to suck down into the gumball inside, she bit into it, chipping one tooth, and making the other wobbly.

An ambulance was called and Wasim went to hospital, where an X-ray and CT scan found that she had suffered two fractures in her jaw.

In fact, the wobbly tooth became loose because it was on top of the bone, which split.

After one hour in surgery, Wasim's jaw was finally put back in place and a bar was put in between her top and bottom gums, wiring it shut for several weeks.

However, even after the procedure, Wasim's wobbly tooth is now sideways, her front teeth have separated and she will need braces to fix her bottom teeth.

Wasim, who was forced to endure an all-liquid diet for several weeks, has a few words of wisdom for others out there with a sweet tooth:

"It was such a stupid thing, people break their jaws in car accidents and fights, this was such an avoidable way to break your jaw," she told *Metro.co.uk*.

"It's better to take the six weeks to get through to it than having six weeks suffering the consequences of biting it and having your jaw wired shut."

# It's never too late to quit



**QUITTING** smoking after a cancer diagnosis can give people months or even years longer to live, depending on the type of cancer, according to international research led by the University of NSW.

The team looked at data on over 30,000 cancer patients with a tracked smoking history.

For cancers with a better prognosis, like prostate and breast cancer, quitting smoking provided a median gain of 2.1 years.

Cancers with a poorer prognosis, like lung and brain cancer, delivered a median gain of three months.

The figure averaged across all cancers was 11 months.

"The earlier you stop smoking, the more beneficial it is, but it can still make a difference after a cancer diagnosis," said senior author Associate Professor Freddy Sitas, from UNSW's International Centre for Future Health Systems.

He added that improvements in cancer survival rates since the data was collected meant the estimated benefits of quitting smoking post cancer diagnosis were likely on the conservative side - as survival rates continue to rise, so will the benefits of quitting smoking post diagnosis.

In addition to giving people with cancer more time, quitting smoking can improve their quality of life and reduce toxicity from radiotherapy. "Smoking during cancer treatment causes significant side effects so it is important for oncology staff to take smoking seriously and encourage their patients to quit," A/Prof Sitas said.

"The minute you stop smoking, your response to radiotherapy is better, your response to chemotherapy is better - there are less toxic side effects."

"The last thing you want to do while you're being treated is smoke," he said.

However, he acknowledged that quitting smoking is of little priority or benefit for some, such as those with late-stage cancer.

"Some people might question if it is worth quitting after a cancer diagnosis, but it does matter," said first author, Dr Nina El-Haddad.

"Smoking impacts the effectiveness of the treatment people receive, the risk of their cancer reoccurring and their risk of getting a secondary cancer as well.

"If you quit, you have a better chance of survival, so it's crucial."

The researchers hope the numbers provide a clear guide to cancer patients about the benefits of quitting, but also prompt health practitioners to initiate more conversations on smoking cessation programs and benefits.

#### Free counselling

AUSTRALIANS for Mental Health has welcomed the government's announcement to make online and phone counselling free for Australians.

A free digital mental health support service will be available through Medicare by Jan 2026, the government said.

Executive Director Chris Gambian said the new service will take pressure off a system struggling to meet the needs of Australians.

"Making it easier for people, especially young people, to get support as early as possible and at no cost will be a gamechanger," Gambian said.

Nearly 40% of Australians aged 16-24 experienced a mental health disorder in the past year - a figure which has increased by 50% since 2007.

#### Juvenile arthritis

AUSTRALIAN Govenor-General Sam Mostyn AC has become the patron of Juvenile Arthritis Foundation Australia (JAFA) in an effort to raise awareness of the condition.

The Govenor-General will host families at Government House in Canberra this week as part of events to mark Juvenile Arthritis Week this week.

According to JAFA, an estimated 30,000 children and young adults under 24 are living with juvenile arthritis.

The association said awareness of the painful and incurable condition is low, even among healthcare professionals and that some children already have permanent damage by the time they are diagnosed.
