Blackmores profit surge

BLACKMORES this morning announced a \$17.5m profit for the nine months to 31 Mar, up 19.6% on the same period in 2007.

Total sales were up 5.2% to \$133.2m, with Australia contributing 6.3% growth across the major channels of Pharmacy and Grocery, the firm said.

Although no new products were launched during the first quarter of 2008, a "heavy product launch programme is planned" for the next quarter, with products incl Odourless Fish Oil, Vegetarian Glucosamine, Prostate Health Formula, Proactive Multi for 50+.

Health workers ignore flu risk

PHARMACISTS and pharmacy assistants may be among the healthcare professionals ignoring this winter's flu risk.

Health experts have warned that influenza vaccination rates among healthcare professionals are unacceptably low, putting them at an increased risk of developing the disease, with potentially serious implications for themselves and their patients.

"Despite the fact that influenza kills more than 2,500 people annually, the people who care for the wellbeing of our community are often the least protected during the influenza season, with 50 to 80 per cent of healthcare professionals not getting vaccinated regularly," said Professor Robert Booy, Influenza Specialist Group (ISG) member.

Pharmacists help heart failure patients

PHARMACISTS can help improve the outcome for hospital patients with heart failure, according to a systematic review in Canada.

Researchers from the University of Alberta found pharmacists working as part of a multidisciplinary team contributed to better outcomes than cases involving pharmacist-directed care.

"This finding is not surprising given that medication management and patient education would complement care given by nurses, physicians, and other healthcare professionals," they wrote in *Archives of Internal Medicine*.

DISPENSARY CORNER

A VILLAGE in England is holding a vote to determine whether it can defect to Wales - in order to obtain free prescriptions for its residents.

Audlem in Cheshire is about 15km from the Welsh border, and has organised an online survey to ask villagers if they want to break away.

Although the tongue-in-cheek poll isn't expected to bring any concrete results, organisers say it's a way of highlighting increasing inequality between different areas of Britain.

If Audlem switched to Wales villagers would also get free parking at hospitals.

PEDICULOSIS treatments will be badly needed for a group of young German artists, who have announced a 'performance art' piece in which they'll live in an Israeli museum for three weeks with lice in their hair.

The Berlin artists will eat and sleep in the gallery, with "the idea being that we live in the museum as their guests, and at the same time we are hosting lice on our heads," said 23-year-old Vincent Grunwald.

The artists will wear plastic shower caps to prevent the lice from spreading, he said, insisting the performance wasn't a stunt.

"We are serious. The lice are part of the art," Grunwald said.

AN ARACHNID invasion last week forced the evacuation of a hospital in Queensland.

The redback spider infestation at Baralaba Hospital meant it was too dangerous for patients.

The hospital only has ten beds, with patients relocated to allow a thorough fumigation.

The spiders took up residence in the hospital to escape recent wet and humid weather.
