# Privacy probe of Sydney pharmacy

THE Australian Privacy Commissioner has launched an investigation after hundreds of credit card receipts from into Chemist Warehouse in Bondi Junction, Sydney were found strewn across a local park.

The Sun Herald said the first dockets, complete with active credit card numbers, expiry dates and signatures, were sighted on 09 Oct and some were still on Mascot Oval over a week later.

Some of the transactions were less than a month old.

A spokesman for the pharmacy, Tony Herro, said he had "no idea" how the receipts came to be strewn across the park.

"There's been no break-in so I need to get to the bottom of this.

"We take the privacy of our customers seriously," he insisted. Privacy Commissioner Karen

Curtis said the probe would "assess whether or not the organisation has met its

obligations under the privacy act."



A TOWNSHIP in Holland has recorded a massive baby boom, nine months after a major power cut meant lights out for two days for its 23,000 citizens.

Last Dec a helicopter crashed into the power lines that supplied electricity to the municipality of Maasdriel in the east of the Netherlands.

In Sep the local hospital delivered 26 babies - a 44% increase on the previous year's figure of 18 births.

Local officials said that while they are keen to boost the local population "we are not envisaging doing so by cutting the power."

PARAMEDICS responded to a fairly unusual medical incident in the UK this week when a 35year-old man became stuck to a toilet with super-glue.

It's understood that a prankster had smeared the chemical on the seat of the toilet, with emergency workers having to remove the stainless steel pan with the man still attached.

After treatment with solvent in hospital a spokesman said the victim "appeared to be none the worse for his ordeal other than being understandably somewhat embarrassed."
