Major cough, cold burden

RESEARCH released yesterday by the Australian Self Medication Industry is claimed to show that minor ailments such as coughs and colds are placing a heavy burden on medical practitioners.

The study, conducted by health industry consultants IMS, showed that 15% of all GP consultations involve these types of complaints.

When that's projected across the country it means 25 million minor consultations a year and almost 15 million prescriptions being provided for minor ailments.

ASMI unveiled the figures at its conference in Sydney, with exec dr Juliet Seifert saying the findings "shed new light on some of the factors behind the heavy workload faced by GPs.

She said there is now a real need to examine alternatives to doctor visits for minor conditions.

"The focus of healthcare should be on encouraging a shift in behavior from GP to self care and pharmacy as the first point of call

Chemconsult stats

HEALTH Information Pharmacy's parent firm Health Corporation says its Chemconsult system has seen pharmacists make a "positive medication intervention" in 23% of prescriptions verified by the consulting program.

Desensitised data from 2204 consultations to 30 Oct revealed the high rate of potential medication errors which were averted using the system.

Influenza trial in phase III

PHASE III trials of Biota Holdings' CS-8958, a long acting neuraminidase inhibitor, are set to commence, the company has announced.

The multi-centre study, to be conducted in Japan, Taiwan, Hong Kong and Korea, will involve adult patients who have naturally acquired influenza A or B.

The study uses 75 mg of oseltamivir twice daily for five days as its control, while a second phase II/III study will also be conducted in Japan on children.

DISPENSARY **CORNER**

MORE groundbreaking medical research from Britain.

A survey conducted this week has reported that favourite UK activities while on the toilet include chatting on mobile phones, reading magazines and sending text messages.

More than 14 million Britons read while on the loo, while 8 million spend time talking either on the phone or to family, while 20% send text messages.

The study was conducted by charity Tear Fund in recognition of World Toilet Day which aims to highlight poor sanitary conditions in the developing world.

MEANWHILE closer to home World Toilet Day was also celebrated in Brisbane yesterday in a much more civilised manner.

About 50 artistically modified toilet bowls were placed on display in the city's central Queen Street Mall, with variants including a barbecue, a tiny garden bed and a fishbowl.

A spokesperson for the International Water Centre said although lots of attention was given to water supply, toilets were often forgotten.

"Nobody talks about toilets, toilets aren't sexy, sanitation isn't sexy," she said.



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
