

Ice action teams call for applications

A PROGRAM to help local communities tackle the impact of ice through 220 community-based local action teams across Australia over the next four years has been announced by the Minister for Health Sussan Ley as part of the National Ice Action Strategy.

Local councils, schools, police, youth services, primary health and treatment services, community groups and non-government organisations would be eligible to be members of a Local Drug Action Team, she said.

Funding of \$19.2 million has been provided to the Alcohol and Drug Foundation to administer the teams, with applications closing 08 Feb - CLICK HERE for details.

Spinraza approval

THE US Food and Drug Administration has approved Spinraza (nusineren), the first drug approved to treat children and adults with spinal muscular atrophy (SMA) - a rare and often fatal genetic disease.

Spinraza is administered as a lumbar injection - see fda.gov.

Repat list correction

THE Health Department has announced a correction to one of its listings in the Repatriation Pharmaceutical Benefits Schedule 01 Jan 2017.

The listing for "clotrimazole 1% vaginal cream, 20g" is incorrectly described in the schedule.

The correct description omits the word "vaginal" as the cream descriptor, as in the previous listing for this item in the 01 Dec 2016 schedule which reads "clotrimazole 1% cream, 20g".


The PBS said the error will be amended as soon as possible.

Traditionally APP is held in Mar, but the Games is forcing a one-off switch to May, with the Guild given first access to the facility once it is handed back by the Games Organising Committee.

APP2018 will therefore take place 03-06 May 2018, with conference chairman Kos Sclavos urging the industry to save the date now.

St Ives lawsuit

TWO US women are suing Unilever, the manufacturer behind St Ives Apricot Scrub, for US\$5m.

The ladies from New York and California are claiming the product has not passed tests by dermatologists, despite proclaiming so on the tube.

They also claim the product, which they say has caused them serious skin irritation, would never be endorsed by any skin care professionals.

In their legal papers the women quote dermatologists who have criticised the facial scrub project, referring to an article in *New York Magazine* which purported it created 'micro-tears' in the skin, making the skin more vulnerable to environmental damages, pollution, and sun damage.

Unilever has put out an official statement saying that "for over 30 years, consumers have loved and trusted the St. Ives brand to refresh and revitalize their skin."

The company said it was "proud to be America's top facial scrub brand and stand by our dermatologist tested formula".

St Ives products are widely stocked in Australia, with Priceline and Chemist Warehouse among major groups which carry the brand.

New QUM standard

THE Australian Pharmacy Council (APC) has flagged upcoming consultations on a proposed accreditation standard for quality use of medicines and prescribing which would cover all 14 health professions regulated in Australia.

The project aims to ensure that graduates from any health degree in Australia "have understanding and competence in the quality use of medicines, for the best health outcomes in our communities".

Outlined in a new year's communication from the APC, the initiative will be undertaken in conjunction with other members of the Health Professions Accreditation Councils' Forum.

Other APC activities flagged for 2017 include ongoing collaboration with the Accreditation Systems Review of the National Registration and Accreditation Scheme, and relocation of APC operations to a new purpose-built ACT Majura Park office adjacent to the Australian Medical Council and Australian Nursing and Midwifery Council.

NDSS indexation

THE co-payments for products available under the National Diabetes Services Scheme were increased in line with the Consumer Price Index on 01 Jan 2017, with the changes impacting blood glucose test strips, urine test strips and insulin pump consumables.

UK pharmacy cuts court hearings

BRITAIN'S High Court has given permission for a judicial review of the UK government's wide-ranging cuts to pharmacy funding.

The case will be brought by the Pharmaceutical Services Negotiating Committee, which announced last month it was planning legal action on the basis that the Secretary of State had "failed to carry out a lawful consultation" on the proposals, which have been strongly opposed by pharmacy stakeholders (*PD* 16 Mar 2016, *PD* 07 Sep 2016).

The hearing is planned for the second week of Feb.

Another legal battle over the cuts is also under way, with lan Strachan, chair of the UK National Pharmacy Association also confirming the "formal launch of High Court proceedings" over claims the 12% funding reductions will disproportionately affect the elderly, disabled and minorities.
