### **FDA pushes generics**

**DRIVEN** by the need to whittle away at the price of pharmaceuticals, the US is approving new generic drugs faster and more consistently than ever, according to a report by the Regulatory Affairs Professionals Society.

CEO of the US Food and Drug Administration Scott Gotlieb last week indicated that the agency would expand abbreviated new drug applications (ANDA) and see priority reviews, which would accelerate generic competitors to market more quickly and help bring down costs.

The years 2016 and 2017 have already seen consecutive record approval numbers.

See the FDA's Generic Drug Review Dashboard at fda.gov. **RAMSAY** Health Care's franchise network expansion into community pharmacy took a significant leap forward when it announced it had inked a deal on 10 Aug to add 18 pharmacies across Queensland by acquiring the Malouf Group (*PD* 23 Aug 17) and now this arrangement has official approval from regulatory authorities.

The deal will be finalised early next month, Ramsay said in a statement.

As previously reported, Malouf's is presently the largest privately owned pharmacy group in Queensland, employing more than 450 staff with pharmacies across Brisbane and surrounding areas, on the Sunshine Coast and in a range of regional locations including Toowoomba, Gympie, Bundaberg, Rockhampton and Mackay.

Malouf founding partner Richard Malouf said, "We are delighted to see the Malouf Pharmacies come into the Ramsay Pharmacy Franchise Network. "Ramsay Health Care is a great organisation with a similar vision and culture to our organisation as well as the commitment to delivering excellent healthcare services," Malouf said.

"We are confident that our pharmacies will be in good hands for the long term and that the health of our customers will come first".

Ramsay Health Care chairman, Michael Siddle said, "Paul Ramsay was a friend to Richard Malouf and would be very pleased with this deal.

"Ramsay Health Care and its franchisees will maintain the excellent service and culture that has made Malouf Pharmacies one of the most reputable pharmacy brands in Queensland for over 50 years," Siddle added.

He also confirmed there would be no changes to operations for Malouf Pharmacies at this stage, with rewards programs and current staff kept in place.

### **Lilly drops Axiron**

**ELI** Lilly Australia has agreed with owner Acrux to cease promoting the transdermal testosterone solution Axiron, returning the product to its maker who said it currently has no plans to commercialise Axiron in Australia.

In a Dear Healthcare Professional letter, the company pointed out that the product was not 'A-flagged' and could not therefore be substituted at the pharmacy level.

Patients, estimated at around 2,500 men according to Besins Healthcare, will need to visit their doctors and seek an alternative prescription if they wish to continue testosterone replacement therapy.

Besins, the manufacturer of testosterone replacement therapy Testogel (1% transdermal testosterone gel) is hoping to pick up patients impacted by the sudden withdrawal of Axiron, and to this end is intensifying its promotion to doctors and upping its manufacturing production, said Besins md Geoff Blundell.

### Super Soniic and Hard Rod caps safety alerts

**SAFETY** advisory warnings have been issued by the Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA) around two products which some Australians may have purchased online.

Super Soniic capsules contain the poison strychnine and the undeclared substance sildenafil, posing a serious risk to health.

Similarly Hard Rod Plus capsules contain the undeclared substance aminotadalafil.

Neither the capsules themselves nor the place of manufacture has been approved by the TGA which says these drugs should not be ingested and remaining capsules should be taken to a local pharmacy for safe disposal.

# Call to 'be part of the solution' to AMR

**HEALTH** professionals and the public are being asked by the Australian Commission on Safety and Quality in Health Care to 'be part of the solution' and take action to slow the development of antibiotimicrobial resistance (AMR).

The call comes as part of the global Antibiotic Awareness Week (13-19 Nov) campaign endorsed by the World Health Organization.

The Commission's senior medical advisor Professor John Turnidge said, "This Antibiotic Awareness Week we want

to encourage people to take action to slow



antibiotic resistance by reducing unnecessary prescriptions for antibiotics."

Citing some recent gains noted in the Commission's Antimicrobial Use and Resistance in Australia (AURA) 2017, Turnidge said the results were encouraging, and it was "good to see the message beginning to get through."

He sounded a note of caution however referencing the lack of improvement in community clinic antibiotic prescribing habits and subsequent rise of MRSA bloodstream infections.

### Peanut allergy patch

**PEOPLE** allergic to peanuts might soon be able to breathe easier, as peanut patches designed to help those with allergies to become less sensitive have shown promise in a recent US clinical trial published on the JAMA network.

The patch gives the patient continual exposure to controlled amounts of peanut proteins and doesn't pose the risk of triggering the allergy that actually eating

peanuts would, researchers explain. The trial used patches with low, intermediate and high doses of peanut protein and compared them to a placebo patch.

### Aussies tick euthanasia

ALMOST 90% of Australians aged 18+ are in favour of "letting patients die when they are hopelessly ill and experiencing unrelievable suffering with no chance of recovery", according to a special Roy Morgan Snap SMS Survey.

In contrast, just 10% (down 7%) say doctors should "try to keep patients alive" and 3% (down 11%) are undecided.

The support for assisted dying at 87% is up a significant 18% since the May 1996 survey.

Analysis shows that large majorities of supporters of all parties now support euthanasia, led by 91% of Greens voters, 88% of National voters, 87% of ALP voters and 86% of Liberal voters.

### Speech recognition embryonic for e-health

ALTHOUGH the use of speech recognition technology has been touted as a means of reducing the time and effort to capture and record information, it is still not yet ready for use in settings that require highly accurate information, such as healthcare, according to a study published in JAMIA.

Authors report that speech recognition was more error-prone and more time-consuming than a keyboard with mouse.
