NPS partners with NCIRS

FLU SHOTS

NPS MedicineWise has announced a partnership with the National Centre for Immunisation Research and Surveillance (NCIRS) to deliver a landmark, nationally

coordinated immunisation support program for Primary **Health Networks** (PHNs) across Australia, including pharmacies.

The program, entitled the **Primary Health Networks** Immunisation Support Program, will be co-designed with PHNs to better support and coordinate immunisation providers and services in their regions.

The aim is to ensure PHN efforts across the country deliver on National Immunisation Program goals and are as consistent as possible, while addressing specific challenges in their local areas.

Immunisation providers, including GPs, nurses, community health clinics, Aboriginal Medical Services, local councils and pharmacies

Six new ingredients

THE Therapeutic Goods Administration has this month updated its Permissible Ingredients Determination as No. 4 of 2017, adding six new ingredients, changing guidelines around 276 existing ingredients and removing five ingredients that have been. determined not to be suitable for inclusion in listed medicines.

such a nationally significant and essential undertaking to enhance the effectiveness of immunisation services throughout the country.

"Supporting the invaluable work of PHNs by ensuring they are well-equipped with consistent and tailored immunisation information for the health professionals working in their local communities, is our priority in the development of this new program," she said.

Price disclosure bites

THE Pharmaceutical Benefits Scheme Oct cycle of price cuts took effect on Sat as posted initially in Jun (PD 20 Jun 17), with indicative pricing in Jul (PD 17 Jul 17) and a Pharmacy Guild of Australia analysis revealing an anticipated saving to taxpayers of around \$99m (PD 17 Aug 17).

Some major impacted products include atorvastatin, oral contraceptive Levlen, cold sore treatment Zovirax and more.

Health Minister Greg Hunt claims savings of more than half a billion dollars over the next four years.

Portable ice test

RESEARCHERS in Korea have developed a wireless sensor and a smartphone app that can detect the presence of amphetamines in human urine in just seconds.

The device is also portable enough to be worn as a bracelet, has unprecedented



sensitivity for amphetamines with low risk for false-positive results, and costs about \$50 to produce.

The inventors said the system does away with the need for expensive equipment that requires long analysis time and highly skilled technicians to operate.

Scientists presented their proofof-concept design last week in the journal *Chem* - **CLICK HERE**.

Continuous glucose monitoring tick

THE first continuous glucose monitoring system for adults 18+ years living with diabetes has been approved by the US Food and Drug Administration (FDA).

Named the FreeStyle Libre
Flash Glucose Monitoring System
from Abbott Diabetes Care, the
system requires no calibration
by a fingerprick blood test and
can be used by adult patients to
make diabetes
treatment
decisions.

The system reduces the

need for fingerstick testing by using a small sensor wire inserted below the skin's surface that continuously measures and monitors glucose levels, and can be worn for up to 10 days, the FDA said.

Users determine glucose levels by waving a dedicated mobile reader (pictured) above the sensor wire to determine if glucose levels are too high (hyperglycemia) or too low (hypoglycemia), and how glucose levels are changing.

NAPSA ticks residency

WITH more than 100 residents located in 30 accredited hospital and health service sites for the Society of Hospital Pharmacists of Australia (SHPA) residency program across the country (*PD* 12 Sep 17), the National Australian Pharmacy Students' Association (NAPSA) has spoken up in support.

NAPSA president Sandra Minas said it wasan outstanding result for the first accreditation round.

SHPA has now launched the next round of accreditation for sites seeking SHPA approval to begin their residency program in 2018.

The SHPA Residency Program is a structured, practice-based program conducted over two years providing a fast track to advanced practice for early career pharmacists as they progress through four sixmonth rotations to foster intensive experiential learning.

Minas added that it was important that NAPSA members normalise, support, adopt and champion the SHPA program.

an unrealised opportunity to transform part of the nation's \$50 billion annual food waste bill into profitable ingredients for the burgeoning local nutraceutical and food ingredients industry.

Sourcing local

nutraceutical ingredients for vitamin and health supplements produced in Australia, an industry worth \$4.7 billion annually, is a new challenge for Australia's agribusiness sector - leveraging the value of respected all-Australian products especially in lucrative Asian markets.

The solution of transforming surplus horticulture and food waste, such as grape seed extract, into valuable nutraceutical ingredients is an aim of the proposed Fight Food Waste & Fraud Cooperative Research Centre.

PRESCRIPTION drugs gabapentin and pregabalin are to be reclassified by the UK government as a class C controlled substance, after experts issued safety warnings following an increase in deaths linked to its use.

A Home Office consultation has been launched in response to growing pressure for the drug to be reclassified to tackle misuse.

Addiction group Addaction lead pharmacist Rachel Britton said the deaths were associated with a cocktail of CNS affecting drugs which can eventually suppress respiration causing death.
