Deprescribing focus

THIS month's edition of the Society of Hospital Pharmacists of Australia's Journal of Pharmacy Practice and Research (JPPR) focuses on medicines deprescribing, saying "mitigation of sub-therapeutic or potentially harmful polypharmacy as integral to all pharmacy practice".

An editorial by Editor-in-Chief of the SHPA flagship journal, Dr Chris Alderman, questions why the deprescribing movement is still struggling to find widespread traction, while other articles feature 10 recommendations for system-level improvements in the quality use of medications for older people in Australia.

Fred IT national RTPM deal

FRED IT Group has been appointed by the Federal Health Department to create and implement a new National Data Exchange (NDE) service, which will

underpin the eventual national roll-out of real-time monitoring of prescription medications (RTPM).

Fred CEO Paul
Naismith said the company's recent
experience in the development of
Victoria's new SafeScript system
would be "invaluable in extending

to health professionals in all states

The \$23 million contract will see the company "design, build and deliver the software system for the National Data Exchange" component of the system, with the project involving working closely with medical and pharmacy software vendors and jurisdictions to provide a consistent experience for health professionals practising

in different environments.

The system will also reflect individual state and territory requirements, Fred said.

"The introduction of a national

approach to realtime prescription monitoring will play a significant role in preventing prescription

medication misuse," Naismith said.

The system will provide health professionals with accurate and upto-date clinical data about patient prescriptions, and thereby enable doctors and pharmacists to identify and support at-risk patients.

Telstra Health, the 50% owner of Fred along with the Pharmacy Guild of Australia, welcomed the announcement, with MD Mary Foley saying "platforms such as this leverage our rapidly digitising healthcare environment to connect healthcare silos, and will support providers to improve medication safety in the community".

Healthscope bid

PRIVATE hospital operator Healthscope has confirmed an unsolicited takeover bid from private equity group BGH Capital.

The proposal, described as a "preliminary, non-binding indication of interest" specifies an indicative price of \$2.36 in cash per share for the company, with the offer seeing the company soar almost 20% to \$2.13 yesterday.

Healthscope operates 43 hospitals across Australia, with the majority of the pharmacy operations at the hospitals conducted in partnership with HPS (*PD* 18 Jul 2016).

WA board meetings

THE Pharmacy Registration Board of Western Australia has said it would meet on the third Wed of every month from Jan 2019.

For the board to consider an application at a particular meeting it must be received no later than 20 business days prior to the meeting, and must be lodged electronically.

THE Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA) is proposing to go purely digital with its updated submissions platform and seeks stakeholder input.

As part of the TGA's electronic dossier reforms agenda, it is planning to provide an "updated electronic submissions platform that is appropriate for Australian sponsors and is cognisant of the best-practice initiatives that are operating in the international environment...providing a single, standardised dossier format forms part of this agenda."

Congratulations to yesterday's winner,

proposes to adopt as it transitions to accepting only eCTD formatted dossiers for prescription medicines.

The eCTD format was introduced within Australia in 2015, however it has been internationally utilised since 2003, following sign off by the International Council for Harmonisation of Technical Requirements for Pharmaceuticals for Human Use (ICH), with the purpose of standardising dossier format globally and making the process more efficient for sponsors and regulators.

The consultation calls for input relating to suggested improvements, any perceived impacts on business, costs and benefits anticipated and suggestions around education and guidance material.

THE Australian Competition and Consumer Commission has issued a warning about scammers who are "increasingly using fake charities or impersonating real charities to take advantage of people's generosity".

So far in 2018 the ACCC's Scamwatch has received almost 700 reports of fake charity scams, with more than \$320,000 in reported losses.









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Dispensary Corner

CALL it the Great Kansas Colon Caper of 2018: police in the US midwest are on the look-out for a giant inflatable model of a human intestine that appears to have been stolen from a university cancer research centre.

According to the Kansas City Star, the three-metre organ is worth US\$4,000 and was lifted from the bed of a parked pick-up truck last week.

The walk-through educational aid had been enlisted to help spread the word about colon cancer at a charity run, but ended up being a no-show.

"Colon cancer is a tough subject for many to talk about and the giant, 150-pound, ten-foot-long inflatable colon is a great conversation starter," said University of Kansas Cancer Center surgical oncologist John Ashcraft of the missing item.

Anyone who knows its whereabouts is asked to call Kansas City police.

IN A development as predictable as the onset of midnight munchies, police in Canada have been called to help manage frustrated crowds after the country's recent legalisation of recreational cannabis led to a run on supply at key retailers.

According to The Independent, the change in law has resulted in long queues and stock shortages as retailers struggled to keep up with a not-so-chilled clientele.

"We expected, you know, certain strains might run out and there would be a bit of a run on supply," conceded former Toronto police chief Bill Blair who led the legalisation process.
