# **MATES update**

THE Veterans' Medicines Advice and Therapeutics Education Services project (Veterans' MATES) has released a new educational topic for patients and health professionals.

The new "Staying healthy at home" module features educational material on helping patients with cognitive impairments to function successfully at home.

Of the estimated 436,400 Australians living with dementia in 2018, 94% were aged over 65 years.

One in three of them live alone at home, while 40% live in regional, rural or remote communities where access to services is often limited.

The therapeutic brief provides information about Department of Veterans' Affairs-funded cognitive, dementia and memory assistive aids - see veteransmates.net.au. # **PBS additions**

HEALTH Minister Greg Hunt yesterday announced the Pharmaceutical Benefits Scheme listing of "crucial medicines" to treat cancer, motor neurone disease and Parkinson's disease.

The PBS additions, all effective from 01 Apr 2019, include \$19m to broaden the listing of Adcetris (brentuximab vedotin) to include treatment of cutaneous T-cell lymphomas; the first time PBS listing of Xadago (safinamide) for the treatment of Parkinson's disease; and Teglutik (riluzole) for the treatment of amyotrophic lateral sclerosis.

NPS urges CM disclosure

"Complementary medicines may interact with your prescription and over-the-counter medicines which may cause you harm, so reveal all your medicines to your pharmacist before you buy a complementary medicines," NPS MedicineWise said.

A survey commissioned by the organisation found that just 20% of Australians "never" take a complementary medicine, while about eight million people take two or more CMs in any given week.

The same Galaxy poll found that of Australians taking complementary medicines every day, 59% also take daily doses of prescription medications.

NPS MedicineWise medical adviser Jill Thistlethwaite said for people taking complementary medicines, "your pharmacist can give you advice on which are safe for you to take".


# CA++ in pregnancy

### serious misconduct".

"The respondent says that it has CCTV footage of the applicant (on 31 Aug 2018) mixing prescription medication for a customer, dispensing that medication from the mixing bottle/vessel," the Commission said.

The Commission noted the pharmacist admitted consuming the leftover medication, but claimed he was "tasting it for consistency and quality reasons" - something he said he was permitted to do as a qualified pharmacist.

Chemist Warehouse disagreed with this assertion, and also confirmed it had lodged a complaint about the pharmacist's behaviour with AHPRA.

Prior to his dismissal, the pharmacist made various complaints to Chemist Warehouse including some in relation to allegations of bullying, however, the Commission reported that it did not receive evidence to suggest the employer had contravened the relevant provisions of the Fair Work Act.
