New IR reforms 'counterproductive'

PHARMACY workers are being warned against signing up to new enterprise agreements if the Federal Government's *Industrial Relations Omnibus Bill* is passed.

Employee pharmacist union group, Professional Pharmacists Australia (PPA), has warned the new industrial relations (IR) reforms "will hurt pharmacy workers by undermining their pay and conditions and by stripping away the rights of casual workers".

PPA President, Dr Geoff March, said the legislation contains "a range of troubling reforms", which he said may make enterprise agreements more attractive to pharmacy owners who were previously resistant to them.

"Pharmacy employees should be wary of any approach from their employer to enter into an enterprise agreement if this new Bill is passed, as their employer may be seeking to reduce their pay and conditions," he said. "Pharmacy employees should immediately contact the union if they are confronted with a new enterprise agreement by their employer."

March added the Bill would also introduce new part-time flexibility provisions to the Pharmacy Industry Award, which he said would "enable employers to only pay part-time employees who work overtime at their normal hourly rate time instead of the current Award requirement for them to be paid at overtime rates".

Professionals Australia CEO, Jill McCabe described the reforms as counterproductive.

"The fact we are still facing tough economic times where the need to increase consumer spending is paramount to recovery, yet the government is proposing laws which will result in workers having less money in their pockets to spend, is simply nonsensical," she said.

"PPA will not accept proposed



changes that leave pharmacy employees worse off and we will be actively opposing any attempts to water down workplace rights."

Addressing the issue in the House of Representatives last week, pharmacist turned MP, Emma McBride, warned the Bill would see pharmacy assistants who work a 38-hour week up to \$6,000 a year worse off

"Why is the Government's Christmas 'thank you' to frontline workers a cut to their take-home pay?" she asked.

Hornsby Hospital pharmacy robot

HORNSBY Ku-ring-gai Hospital has become the first public hospital pharmacy in NSW to implement a robotic dispensing and stocktaking system as part of a \$265 million State Two redevelopment program.

NSW Health Minister, Brad Hazzard, said the redevelopment program is on track for completion in 2021, which has seen the opening of a new intensive care unit.

"The new, state-of-the-art pharmacy is also more than double in size and, thanks to its advanced robotics, can select and dispense medications and conduct stocktakes faster, reducing errors and wastage and allowing pharmacists to spend more time with patients," he said.

The hospital will also include a co-located education space with the University of Sydney.

Choice Pharmacy backs Safe Shelter

CHOICE Pharmacy Bomaderry is teaming up with Rotary Nowra to support local homeless charity, Safe Shelter Shoalhaven.

With approximately 1,000 people homeless in the Shoalhaven, Choice Pharmacy has been providing support to those with no place to call home in the area, the South Coast Register reported.

No time to wait for naloxone funding

VICTORIAN MP. Dr Tim Read. is calling on the State Government to cover pharmacists' fees for the administration of opioid replacement therapies, including naloxone.

The Greens MP noted patients taking methadone faced dispensing fees of close to \$140 a month, because the medications have not been covered by the Pharmaceutical Benefits Scheme (PBS).

Speaking in the Legislative Assembly last week, Read said, "ideally the Commonwealth would pay the pharmacist this fee for their service, but while they do not, Victoria should step in".

The Brunswick-based GP turned politician told the Assembly that intensive care admissions linked to heroin use cost the State \$5,000 a day, while methadone fees were around \$35 a week.

"Other states subsidise this treatment, and Victoria already pays for opiate replacement for

those aged 18 and under and for recently released prisoners," he said.

"Opiate replacement therapies help people with addiction take control of their lives.

"Helping more people onto these therapies will prevent overdoses and expensive hospital admissions.

"Subsidising this treatment will help people remain on therapy and prevent much of the crime and imprisonment associated with an addiction to an illegal drug.

"All of this will save the state money, and this is why removing fees for opiate replacement therapy was recommended by pharmacy and medical bodies and by the Law Reform, Road and Community Safety Committee in their 2018 report.

"According to budget figures, about 14,000 Victorians currently receive this treatment.

"However, global disruption to the illegal heroin supply due to COVID-19 has reportedly led to



more people recently seeking opiate replacement therapy.

"We cannot continue this decades-long wait for the Commonwealth to pay because if we do not act now, all Victorians will lose."

Read also noted that "less than half the pharmacies in Victoria provide opiate replacement therapy because the financial support is inadequate."

Rise in number of vax complaints

MEDICAL indemnity insurer, MDA National, has reported that it has received "an increasing number of calls and formal complaints regarding vaccination errors".

In a statement issued last week, the insurer said "the increase may be due to an ever changing and increasingly complex national immunisation schedule and public awareness regarding immunisation".

"Most errors occur either during vaccine selection and preparation, or history checking and scheduling," MDA National said.

AUTHORITIES in Taiwan are pretty strict about COVID-19 as evidenced by a AU\$6,000 fine issued to a man who stepped outside his hotel quarantine room for just eight seconds.

The migrant worker from the Philippines was isolating at a hotel in Kaohsiung and ducked out briefly to leave something outside the room of a colleague.

Hotel staff captured the moment on CCTV and reported the incident to the Health Department which levied the hefty penalty for the infringement.

Taiwan's strict approach to coronavirus has been cited for the country's success during the pandemic, with a total of just over 700 cases & seven deaths.

AND on a similar topic, new COVID-19 guidance from the Civil Aviation Administration of China (CAAC) recommends that flight attendants should wear nappies while on duty so they can minimise bathroom breaks.

Released last week, the Sixth Edition of the CAAC's Technical Guidelines for **Epidemic Prevention and** Control for Airlines states: "it is recommended that cabin crew members wear disposable diapers and avoid using the lavatories barring special circumstances to avoid infection risks".

Other recommendations for flight attendants include medical masks, double-layer disposable medical gloves and goggles along with disposable hats, clothes and shoe covers.
