Pharmacy welcomes Budget 2020-21

MEASURES aimed at boosting access to new medicines through the Pharmaceutical Benefits Scheme (PBS), increased investment in aged care and additional funding for mental health services, announced in last night's Federal Budget, are being welcomed by the pharmacy sector.

Pharmaceutical Society of Australia (PSA) Acting President, Michelle Lynch, said the Government's \$2.8 billion investment in listing new medicines over the next four years would improve access to medicines,

while adding that the PBS Unique Identification Framework will improve medicines safety "by allowing the assessment and tracking of medicines when they come into Australia, through to

dispensing of medicines to patients". "This will support medicine recalls and reduce the potential for

counterfeit medicines," she said. Lynch added the allocation of funding for 23,000 home care packages for aged care patients and \$5.7 billion to be spent on mental health, would lay the groundwork

for the future with opportunities for pharmacists to do more to improve the safe use of medicines in the areas of aged care and mental health.

Pharmacy Guild of Australia **Executive Director, Suzanne** Greenwood, has also voiced support for the Budget measures.

"The Government has rightly declared mental health and suicide prevention as a national priority," she said.

"Community pharmacies are the most accessible of all health destinations, and as such pharmacists and their staff play an important role in identifying and assisting patients with mental health issues.

"On aged care, we strongly support the significant announcement of \$1.6 billion for an additional 23,000 home care packages for older Australians who want to keep living at home."

Medicines Australia backs Budget

THE Federal Government's commitment to improving the health of Australians as part of the nation's COVID-19 pandemic recovery through investments guaranteed funding for new Pharmaceutical Benefits Scheme (PBS) listings, is being welcomed by Medicines Australia.

Responding to last night's Federal Budget, Medicines Australia CEO, Elizabeth de Somer, backed a number of measures aimed at protecting the health of Australians and the economy, announced by Treasurer, Josh Frydenburg.

"The linkages between our health and productivity have never been clearer, with the Government's announcement of the new medicines funding guarantee, worth at least \$2.8 billion over four years, starting immediately and at the same time, removing the requirement for cost offsets for new medicine listings on the PBS," she said.

"This is going to allow for medicines to be listed faster, without the need to find additional



savings from other critical health areas."

de Somer also backed the Government's \$12 million investment to modernise the Therapeutic Goods Administration's business systems to streamline processes for the pharmceutical industry and reduce red tape for new medicines.

Federal Health Minister, Greg Hunt, also announced the Government will "complete new long-term agreements with

Cannabis research cost recovery

FEDERAL Budget papers reveal the Government will provide for the administration and regulation of medicinal cannabis research, cultivation and manufacture.

"This will provide for full cost recovery for all medicinal cannabis commercial licence holders and maintain the existing partial cost recovery for noncommercial research licence holders," Budget papers noted.

"The Government will also support the continued functions of the Australian Advisory Council on the Medicinal Use of



Cannabis to provide advice and guidelines on the regulation of medicinal cannabis."

The measure will result in an additional investment of \$1.7 million over the next four years. Medicines Australia and the Generic and Biosimilar Medicines Association to commence at the expiry of the current agreements to 2022", as part of the planned \$467 billion health and aged care Budget over the forward estimates.

"These agreements, to be finalised over the coming months, will help ensure continued access to new medicines for patients and provide certainty for the medicines industry and incentives to invest in Australia." Hunt said.

Dispensary Corner

AN IRISH pharmacist has narrowly avoided a prison sentence after pleading guilty to siphoning off prescription medications to share with his social group.

Dublin Circuit Criminal Court heard John O'Meara, 42, was a "Jekyll and Hyde type of character" with a "party lifestyle" who fell in with the wrong crowd.

O'Meara lodged a guilty plea yesterday to charges relating to the possession of prescription tablets for sale or supply at his home on 24 Aug 2018, when police found 1,700 Xanax tablets and 330 Ritalin tablets.

The Court heard O'Meara was suspended from practicing as a pharmacist since Sep 2019, following an investigation into the three pharmacies he owns by the Pharmaceutical Society of Ireland.

Judge Pauline Codd said O'Meara's actions had breached the trust members of the public have in pharmacists.

Issuing an 18-month suspended sentence, Judge Codd said she was taking into account the pharmacist's "particular vulnerabilities" from a young age and evidence that he was "using the supply of drugs as a means of sustaining friendships", *BreakingNews.ie* reported.
