Wesfarmers Health reports \$45m profit

THE recently formed Wesfarmers Health division, which was created when the conglomerate acquired Australian Pharmaceutical Industries last year (*PD* 21 Jan 2022), has seen strong growth in its wholesale business, according to the Wesfarmers Annual Report which was released on Fri.

The division also cited elevated sales of COVID-19 antiviral products amounting to over \$300 million and "solid sales results for the year" via the Priceline Pharmacy network, with growth across health and beauty categories which moderated in the second half of the 2022/23 financial year.

Overall revenue for the Health businesses was \$5.3 billion, with earnings of \$45 million amid a swathe of merger and acquisition activity including the purchase of InstantScripts for \$135 million which settled on 03 Jul.

In late Jun, Wesfarmers also entered into a Scheme Implementation Deed with



SILK Laser Australia, which will complement the group's existing Clear Skincare clinics.

The past year also saw

Wesfarmers increase its stake in the SiSU health station business to 60%. As at 30 Jun 2023 the Health division included 390 Priceline Pharmacy franchise stores and 76 company-owned Priceline outlets. There are 43 pharmacies

operating under the Soul Pattinson Chemist banner, and 53 Pharmacist Advice outlets.

Wesfarmers said the Health division has a "complementary portfolio of health, wellbeing and beauty assets that is well positioned to deliver long-term growth and capitalise on health sector tailwinds".

However, near-term market conditions are expected to remain challenging, with the division actively managing the impacts of cost inflation as well as changes to the PBS and the implications of the 60-Day Dispensing policy.

The Health division continues to pursue logical expansion opportunities across digital health, medical aesthetics and pharmaceutical wholesale, according to the report.

Headache implant

IN A medical milestone, an Australian patient at Nambour Selangor Private Hospital, Qld, became the first patient to receive Salvia BioElectronics' paper-thin neuromodulation solution for severe migraines and cluster headaches.

This procedure marks the first time that bioelectronic foils have been implanted, the company stated.

Dr Paul Frank, the interventional pain specialist who performed the procedure, said that it "ushers in a new era of possibilities in headache treatment".

The first patient, a 29-yearold woman from Australia who has suffered from debilitating headaches since the age of 14, "experienced immediate and remarkable improvements in the frequency and intensity of her cluster headache attacks following the treatment", added Frank.

Dispensary Corner

WE'RE all aware of the stimulative effects of caffeine, but it appears that coffee is also now able to boost the performance of concrete.

Researchers at Melbourne's RMIT University have developed a new technique which claims to make the vital construction material 30% stronger by adding processed waste coffee grounds to the mix.

Published recently in the Journal of Cleaner Production, a report on the breakthrough describes how the grounds are converted to "biochar" by roasting them at 350°c without oxygen present.

Lead author for the study, Dr Rajeev Roychand, explained "the disposal of organic waste poses an environmental challenge as it emits large amounts of greenhouse gases including methane and carbon dioxide, which is contributing to climate change".

He noted that Australia generates about 75,000 tonnes of ground coffee waste each year, with Roychand quipping that "the inspiration for our work was to find an innovative way of using the large amounts of coffee waste in construction projects rather than going to landfill - to give coffee a 'double shot' at life".



Typhoid patch pursued



VAXXAS has been awarded \$5.4m by global charitable foundation, Wellcome, to pursue a Phase I clinical study, with a potential second-generation typhoid vaccine, delivered by Vaxxas' proprietary high-density microarray patch (HD-MAP).

Vaxxas CEO David Hoey (**pictured**) said, "we believe our HD-MAP has the potential to play a critical role in extending the global reach of typhoid conjugate vaccines, and make a significant difference to the lives of many".

The typhoid vaccine formulation used to coat the HD-MAP will be based on an approved typhoid conjugate vaccine that was jointly developed by Vaxxas' collaborator in this project, SK bioscience, and the International Vaccine Institute. The typhoid vaccine candidate used in these studies will be formulated to be stable at higher temperatures than for needle and syringe vaccination, Hoey added.

"Improved thermostability of vaccine products is a key potential benefit offered by Vaxxas' HD-MAP platform, and has the potential to reduce the cost and complexity of cold-chain distribution and storage, which are both significant barriers to vaccine accessibility in lowerand middle-income countries.

"The HD-MAP also has the potential benefit of requiring less training to administer and even self-administration," Hoey said. The project is expected to be completed within two years.

Cramp Bark: a wonder ingredient

CRAMP bark, scientifically known as viburnum opulus, is a native plant that is traditionally used for its medicinal properties. The name "cramp bark" is derived from its historical use to relieve muscle cramps and spasms. Some key information about the plant is:

1. Traditional use: cramp bark has been used for centuries in traditional herbal medicine, particularly by Native American and European herbalists, to alleviate various conditions such as menstrual cramps, muscle spasms, and other types of pain.
