## Batch recall on

## OW plans "mass rollout"

OPTOMETRIST Warehouse (OW) Managing Director Peter Larsen has confirmed it's "business as usual" for the new optometry network after major news last week that Chemist Warehouse plans to merge with Sigma Healthcare to create Australia's largest pharmacy group, potentially worth more than \$8.8 billion, reported *Insight* (PD 07 Dec). Chemist Warehouse made headlines earlier this year when it announced plans to "disrupt" Australia's optometry market by launching Optometrist Warehouse in the Melbourne suburb of Malvern (PD 03 May).

It has since opened a second store in Campbelltown in Sydney, with plans for a "mass network rollout".

## Pregnancy no answer for endometriosis

RESEARCH shows patients with endometriosis are being told to plan a pregnancy to help manage or treat the condition, despite a lack of evidence to show it reduces symptoms.

The controversial advice has prompted calls to improve medical education about endometriosis.

More than 3,000 medically diagnosed patients were surveyed across the globe as part of the collaborative study involving researchers from the University of Adelaide, University of Sydney and EndoActive, a charity focusing on awareness, information, and advocacy.

The research, which focused on patient experiences, revealed more than half (1,892 of 3,347 total) were advised to fall pregnant or have a baby to manage or treat endometriosis,

which can include severe pelvic pain and infertility.

Almost 90% (1,691 of 1,892) of endometriosis patients were given this recommendation by healthcare professionals, including gynaecologists and GPs, with 36% told it would cure their painful condition.

"Pregnancy or having a baby isn't a treatment for endometriosis and this advice from health professionals can have negative impacts on those who receive it," said co-author Prof Louise Hull, a fertility expert from the University of Adelaide's Robinson Research Institute.

Although the advice is well-meaning, in modern practice, there are better ways of dealing with fertility concerns for people with endometriosis, commented the researchers.

## Dispensary Corner

**LEARNING** about how the human body works scientifically is important for all, but an activist history teacher failed a Seattle student on a quiz for saying only women can get pregnant and that only men have penises.

A 10th grade Ethnic Studies World History teacher at Chief Sealth International High School gave students a quiz, titled 'Understanding Gender vs. Sex', to answer either true or false, or questions with multiple choices.

Question four was a true or false question with the statement, 'All men have penises', to which the student noted the statement as 'true' since it is, in fact, true, but the teacher penalised the answer, marking it incorrect, claiming women can have a penis.

Similarly, question seven was a true or false question with the statement, 'Only women can get pregnant', again, the student marked the statement 'true' because only women can get pregnant, again, the teacher penalised the student, insisting the answer is false.

The teacher believes men can get pregnant.

The student's mother wrote to the Jason Rantz Show on *KTTH* expressing her "frustration and anger" at the teacher, and was glad her son stuck to his answers.

She said she expressed concerns to the school, but was "met with silence".

Seattle Public Schools, through a spokesperson, defended the quiz as "inclusive", arguing it was appropriate for an Ethnic Studies course.

## Guild Vic branch against CWG listing

THE Pharmacy Guild of Australia's Vic branch has expressed major concerns about the proposal to reverse list Chemist Warehouse Group (CWG) on the ASX via Sigma Healthcare (**PD 07 Dec**).

Branch President Anthony Tassone (**pictured**) said it is incumbent on the Vic govt, led by Premier Jacinta Allan, and the Victorian Pharmacy Authority (VPA) to ensure the interests of patients are not compromised, and the deal is compliant with existing pharmacy business ownership rules.

"We expect the VPA to run a fine-tooth comb over each detail of this proposal, and to protect the ownership regulations that preserve patients' health ahead of profits," Tassone asserted.

The Vic govt have long been supportive of profession-only



ownership of pharmacies in the interests of patients, and "we expect them to ensure the intent of these laws are upheld," he added.

The Guild stated franchising can, and does, support many community pharmacies to provide healthcare to patients, but laws across Australia prevent non-pharmacists from holding a 'financial', 'ownership', or 'proprietary' interest in a pharmacy.

"Those rules guarantee that community pharmacies remain an essential layer of the health system.

"Community pharmacies provide accessible healthcare at a time when other healthcare providers are falling apart," Tassone said, adding, the VPA must be wary of increased corporatisation in the community pharmacy sector.

"It is not in the interest of patients, or their communities, to have community pharmacies that put shareholders first.

"The language of those pushing this proposal is about a 'unique opportunity for healthcare businesses,'" he explained.

"Medicines are not ordinary items of commerce, and community pharmacy's primary responsibility must remain to patients, not shareholders," urged Tassone. *JG*
