#### New CPD taps into booming market

THE Australasian College of Pharmacy has joined forces with Metagenics to launch a new accreditation program aimed at empowering pharmacists with the knowledge to incorporate natural medicines into their practice.


"Pharmacists are pivotal in guiding patients through holistic health approaches.

#### Hope in blood test

**RESEARCHERS** at Flinders University have identified a promising approach to the early diagnosis and management of autoimmune diseases through a routine blood test.

The Systemic Inflammation Index could leverage routine laboratory data to measure the body's inflammation levels.

According to Strategic Prof of Clinical Pharmacology Arduino Mangoni, this index could change the way more than 80 autoimmune diseases are detected and treated for improved patient outcomes.

#### Get ready for flu season

WITH an alarming increase of flu cases, the Pharmacy Guild of Australia is calling on all eligible individuals to get their flu vaccination as soon as possible.

Reports from the National Notifiable Diseases Surveillance System indicate that in the first guarter of 2024, there were 26,836 reported cases of influenza, a figure that had already doubled compared to the same period last year by Feb.

**Guild National President Trent** Twomey (pictured) emphasised the urgency of getting vaccinated ahead of the flu season, which typically spans from May to Oct.

"Flu vaccines for the 2024 season are now available in community pharmacies nationwide," Twomey stated, highlighting the readiness of community pharmacies to administer the vaccines.

He also pointed out that Queensland residents aged six months and older could receive the flu vaccine for free until 30 Sep. courtesy of the state government.

Similarly, Western Australia has announced free flu shots for all residents aged six months and over during May and Jun (PD 03 Apr).

Twomey stressed the importance of early vaccination to protect against the flu and its complications, noting that while the vaccine's protection lasts throughout the year, it is most effective in the first three to four months after administration.

The Australian Technical Advisory Group on Immunisation recommends that individuals who received a flu vaccine in late 2023 should still get vaccinated for 2024 and that flu vaccines can be administered concurrently with other vaccines, such as COVID-19. JG

#### **PBS** updates

IN A comprehensive update to pharmaceutical benefits regulation, the Department of Health and Aged Care has announced amendments to key instruments governing the listing and funding of pharmaceutical benefits in Australia, which took effect from this week.

A notable change is the removal of the requirement for patient signatures upon receipt of pharmaceutical benefits in pharmacies.

Moreover, the procedure for authorising increases to the maximum quantity of repeats of prescriptions has been revised and is now a more straightforward process.

The Prescriber Bag Determination has also been updated to ensure more judicious management of stock.

These regulatory updates mark a progressive step in streamlining services.

Avene has also introduced



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#### Dispensary Corner

**DOGS**, our loyal four-legged companions, may just be the next big thing in PTSD therapy, thanks to their ability to sniff out an oncoming flashback or episode of distress.

Led by Laura Kiiroja of Dalhousie University, Canada, the research has unearthed a rather remarkable finding that canines are using their olfactory prowess gained over centuries to pick up on the subtleties of human stress markers emitted through breath.

If you thought your dog was just being affectionate by breathing in your morning face, think again; they might be conducting a quick health check-up.

Humans are complex beings, not just emotionally but biochemically, apparently secreting volatile organic compounds (VOCs) that shift with our mood and health.

These VOCs are like aromatic tweets, broadcasting our state of mind to those with the nose to decode them.

The study trained a squad of 25 pet dogs, but only two, Ivy and Callie, proved they had the nose for this nuanced work.

The rest, presumably, were too distracted by squirrels, treats and the aroma of the nearest lamp post.

Ivy and Callie were able to discriminate between stressed and non-stressed breath samples with accuracy, though Ivy showed a preference for anxiety-induced VOCs, while Callie leaned towards those tinged with shame.

#### Gain insights into managing change

IN THE latest instalment of the Raven's Recruitment's Your Pharmacy Career Podcast out now, Vanessa Lontos (pictured) shared her journey from community pharmacist to a leadership role at Sigma Healthcare, culminating in her status as a thought leader in the sector.

The episode, titled 'Empowering Pharmacy Leadership and Patient Care: Vanessa Lontos on Transformation, Coaching, and Personal Growth', explored the critical roles of effective communication, patient engagement, and the lasting impact of ongoing personal and professional development on healthcare outcomes.

Listeners will gain insights into Lontos' methods for improving patient care, highlighting the importance of a cohesive pharmacy team, the value of presence in patient interactions, and the art of delivering concise counselling.

The episode also emphasised the necessity for pharmacy professionals to embrace continuous learning and adept change management, promoting an always-on learning culture, the benefits of peer mentorship, and the integration of personal growth and self-awareness into professional life.

Heidi Dariz, General Manager of Raven's Recruitment, commended the insightful episode, noting, "as the healthcare landscape evolves, Vanessa Lontos' expertise provides invaluable guidance for pharmacy professionals navigating these changes".

The episode is essential for anyone passionate about advancing pharmacy and enhancing patient care through leadership and personal development, she added.



"This episode invites listeners to engage in the transformative paths of pharmacy leadership and patient care, and Lontos' holistic approach to professional development."

Lontos emphasised the importance of pharmacy leaders intentionally setting aside brief, targeted periods, such as five to 10 minutes, for staff to take part in meaningful learning experiences.

She championed the concept of 'five-minute mentors' to foster informal learning opportunities and advocated for experiential learning through shadowing staff and having them listen in on patient conversations.

Lontos underscored the necessity of allowing time and space for planning when enacting changes in the pharmacy environment, alongside leveraging various communication channels to ensure clear and comprehensive dissemination of information regarding changes.

She encouraged empowering team members to engage in decision-making and problemsolving, cultivating a sense of psychological safety within the team to facilitate effective change management in pharmacy.

Recognising the need for a period of stabilisation after changes are implemented, she advised considering the human aspect foremost in change initiatives.

This involves assembling a diverse team, distributing the workload for managing significant changes, and building self-awareness through reflection on emotions, thoughts, and behaviours.

By identifying areas for skill enhancement and setting developmental goals, Lontos suggested fostering a culture of open and honest dialogue within teams about areas for improvement.
