Sigma offers line to ACCC

THE ACCC is seeking public feedback on a proposed court-enforceable undertaking by Sigma Healthcare Limited concerning its acquisition of Chemist Warehouse Group Holdings (PD breaking news).

Sigma, has offered the undertaking in response to competition concerns raised by the ACCC in Jun.

These concerns included potential harm to pharmacies supplied by Sigma and the possibility of Chemist Warehouse accessing competitors' data.

To address these issues, Sigma proposed several measures.

It agreed not to prevent franchisees who entered into contracts before Jan from terminating agreements for three years.

Sigma will also waive fees if these franchisees choose to leave.

Additionally, restrictions will be placed on Sigma's collection and use of patient data for three years.

Sigma has further committed to remaining a pharmaceutical wholesaler under the



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Commonwealth Government's Community Service Obligation (CSO) for at least five years, ensuring consistent service standards, the statement added.

ACCC Chair Gina Cass-Gottlieb said, "while the ACCC is publicly consulting on this undertaking, this should not be interpreted to mean that this or any other form of undertaking will ultimately be accepted by the ACCC".

The regulatory body is continuing to assess the acquisition's impact on competition impact.

Dispensary Corner

SCIENTISTS have discovered a surprising new ally for farmers: human urine, according to a study in *ScienceDaily*.

According to researchers from the University of Birmingham and L'Institut Agro Montpellier, soil bacteria seems to handle urine just as well as synthetic fertilisers.

Turns out, our humble bathroom break could be a goldmine for agriculture.

In their study, the researchers put stored urine onto spinach crops (talk about recycling) and found that it had little effect on soil bacterial communities.

The soil didn't revolt, the pH stayed steady, and the bacteria continued their business as usual.

Even when they increased the dosage, the soil remained resilient, though there was a slight uptick in the nitrifying and denitrifying bacteria - translation: more nitrogen oxides could be emitted.

Manon Rumeau, one of the researchers, said, "our study shows that recycling human urine could enhance sustainability and cut down on synthetic fertilisers".

In short, your trip to the bathroom might one day feed your salad.

With urine composed of 95% water and 5% nutrients, the future of farming could involve us in ways we never imagined.

Just remember to flush...or maybe don't.



Pharmacist's role in vapes

STARTING from today, legislative changes empower pharmacists to prescribe vapes (20mg/ml and under) as Schedule 3 medicines.

However, higher dose vapes and nicotine liquids for mixing will still remain classified as Schedule 4, requiring prescriptions from a doctor or a nurse practitioner.

For anyone under 18, all vaping products will require a script, regardless of nicotine concentration.

The gov't's updated framework aims to enhance pharmacists' role in smoking cessation efforts, allowing them to provide both counselling and prescriptions.

The approach is expected to improve long-term health outcomes for individuals seeking to reduce nicotine dependence.

Pharmacists will also play a critical role in guiding patients with higher

nicotine needs, as these individuals will still need healthcare providers for S4 products.

The new TGA standards mandate that notified vaping products comply with specific packaging and ingredient guidelines, including limiting flavours to menthol, mint, and tobacco, with disposable vapes phased out.

Pharmacists can verify TGA-notified products via its website, though no vapes are currently registered on the Australian Register of Therapeutic Goods.

One product in compliance with TGO 110 standards is Zefir Vape, which offers step-down nicotine dosing, and is available in three strengths (40mg/ml, 20mg/ml, and nicotine-free).

It can be ordered through major pharmaceutical distributors. *JG*

Twomey re-elected

PROFESSOR Trent Twomey, current National President of the Pharmacy Guild of Australia, was re-elected to a second term yesterday (*PD* breaking news).

Twomey noted the Guild's early preparations for the Ninth Community Pharmacy Agreement, set for 2029.

He also highlighted the work on the 2035 Community Pharmacy Plan, to be developed within the first 100 days of the new National Council.

He has outlined plans to evolve community pharmacy focusing on holistic health hubs, and emphasised the sector's shift towards supporting long-term condition management and providing everyday health treatments as patients face rising living costs.

New PBS listing

THE new Hadlima (adalimumab) 40mg/0.4mL formulation will be listed on the PBS from 01 Oct.

Organon Australia has launched this high concentration, citrate-free formulation for treating chronic inflammatory conditions, including rheumatoid arthritis, Crohn's disease, and ulcerative colitis.

The updated biosimilar reduces the injection volume by 50% and eliminates citrate buffers, known to cause injection-site pain.

Additionally, it can be stored at room temperature for up to 31 days, offering improved convenience for patients.

Hadlima is available in autoinjector and pre-filled syringe formats.
