Dispensary Corner

YOUR marriage might come with a surprise health risk especially if your spouse's heart is acting up.

Published in JAMA Neurology, a new study reveals that people are more likely to develop dementia if their spouse has a heart-related incident, like a heart attack or stroke.

Researchers followed the health of over 90,000 Japanese seniors aged 65+, with about half having a spouse who'd suffered a cardiovascular event.

Two years later, those with a heart-troubled partner were more likely to develop Alzheimer's themselves.

Experts believe the reasons are multifaceted: the shock of witnessing the heart event, lifestyle changes to help their partner stay healthy, and the huge stress of wondering if they will ever be able to mow the lawn again.

Because let's face it, being the health manager of your spouse comes with its own burdens like trying to convince them to eat a salad and their greens.

The study, which involved mostly men, suggests that gender could play a role in this unhealthy relationship dynamic, with more research needed.

In the meantime, beware when one spouse's heart goes haywire - the other might just lose their mind.



Tas vape sale restrictions

THE Tasmanian Government announced on Fri new tighter regulations restricting the sale of nicotine-containing vapes to patients with a prescription from a GP or nurse practitioner.

The change effectively implements the previously attempted Commonwealth reform to classify such products as Schedule 4 (Prescription Only), which was supported by community pharmacists across the country and 63 patient, healthcare and school groups.

The state's Pharmacy Guild of Australia branch has welcomed the decision, emphasising its potential to safeguard public health, particularly among young Tasmanians who are disproportionately affected by vape usage.

"This is a common-sense decision to protect the health of Tasmanians," commented Tasmanian Guild President Helen O'Byrne (**pictured**), who attended the announcement alongside Health Minister Guy Barnett.

NT scope boost

THE Country Liberal Party has won the Northern Territory election, and the Pharmaceutical Society of Australia (PSA) has praised the new government's commitment to expanding pharmacy services.

The initiative, through PSA's Pharmacy Scope of Practice program, will enable pharmacists to provide additional health services for up to 21 conditions, including the prescribing of treatment for uncomplicated urinary tract infections (UTIs) within the first 100 days of government.

PSA Northern Territory and South Australia Vice President, Colleen Niland, highlighted the benefits the move will bring to regional and rural communities.

"Empowering pharmacists to prescribe treatment for UTIs improves access to care and health outcomes across the Territory, especially in areas where healthcare services can be limited," explained Niland.

While PSA National President A/Prof Fei Sim said, "our health system is under pressure".

"The time is now to look at innovative models of care where the skill sets of all health professionals, including pharmacists, can be fully utilised to build overall health system capacity as we continue to support our population's health," added Sim.

PSA is encouraging pharmacists to complete the relevant training, including the online course 'Managing uncomplicated cystitis (urinary tract infection)', to ensure they are prepared to deliver the services in the community.
