# Ozempic reduces cancer risk



**PEOPLE** with obesity who take glucagon-like peptide-1 receptor agonists (GLP-1RAs) have a reduced risk of cancer compared to those not using those medications, according to US research published today in *JAMA Oncology*.

GLP-1RAs are the class of diabetes and weight loss drugs including semaglutide (Ozempic) and tirzepatide (Mounjaro).

The team looked at cancer diagnoses over a 10-year period in around 40,000 adults with obesity or who were overweight using the drugs, and compared the findings with 40,000 non-users.

The team focused on 14 cancers, most of which were associated with obesity, and found that those taking GLP-1RAs had a 17% reduction in risk for any type of cancer.

Reduction in risk was even greater for endometrial (25%), ovarian (47%) and meningioma (31%) cancers, while nonsignificant reductions were noted for pancreatic, bladder and breast cancers.

However, there was a slightly increased - but non-significant - risk of kidney cancer among the GLP-1RA cohort, which is consistent with another recent study that

reported an increased risk of kidney cancer among people with type 2 diabetes taking GLP-1RAs compared to those taking metformin.

The researchers said the link needs further investigation.

The team suggested that the overall findings raise the hypothesis that GLP-1RAs may be associated with a lower risk of hormonesensitive cancers.

"Given that more than 137 million individuals in the US are currently eligible for GLP-1RA therapies, even modest changes in cancer risk could have substantial public health implications," wrote the authors.

# Quit Centre highlights pharmacist resources

QUIT Centre provides health professionals with the latest information on smoking and vaping cessation, and has partnered with the Pharmaceutical Society of Australia (PSA) to provide free CPD-accredited training.

Pharmacists and pharmacy assistants can undertake online modules designed to support the development of knowledge and skills to confidently help patients stop either of the habits in a community pharmacy setting.

The two pharmacist modules cover management options for quitting smoking or vaping, and delivering nicotine dependence treatment under the new regulatory framework introduced by the *Therapeutic Goods and Other Legislation Amendment (Vaping Reforms) Act 2024.* 

Other resources include a downloadable infographic on how Quitline can help patients stop smoking or vaping and how to refer patients, and a quarterly e-newsletter.

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## Dispensary Corner

THE oldest living person in the world has just added another candle to her cake, with Ethel Caterham celebrating her 116th birthday yesterday.

The British woman, who was born 21 Aug 1909, is the last living subject of Edward VII, and was born eight years before the Russian Revolution.

Caterham currently resides in a care home in Surrey, which renamed an area of their garden as a tribute to her, and is regularly visited by her three granddaughters.

She survives her husband and their two daughters.

A statement released by the home said: "Ethel and her family are so grateful for all of the kind messages and interest shown to her as she celebrates her 116th birthday this year.

"Ethel will spend the day quietly with her family so that she can enjoy it at her own pace," it concluded.

Caterham is believed to be the fourth Brit to hold the world's oldest title, and is six years younger than the oldest person who ever lived, which is believed to be Frenchwoman Jean Louise Calment, who died in 1997 at the age of 122.

While we are not sure what her secret is, Caterham said during an interview with BBC Radio Surrey in 2020 that she has "taken everything in my stride, the highs and lows".

"I've been all over the world, and I've ended up in this lovely home, where everyone is falling over themselves for me, giving me everything I want."

#### Al could soon predict worsening arthritis

**ARTIFICIAL** intelligence could soon help diagnose worsening knee arthritis, thanks to a new model based on data from the MRIs and biochemical tests of almost 600 patients.

The model improved the accuracy of doctors' predictions of worsening osteoarthritis from 46.9 to 65.4%.

The Australian and international researchers published the model in PLOS Medicine.

"Our study shows that combining deep learning with longitudinal MRI radiomics

and biochemical biomarkers significantly improves the prediction of knee osteoarthritis progression - potentially enabling earlier, more personalised intervention," lead author Ting Wang of Chongqing Medical University said.

"This work is the result of years of collaboration across multiple disciplines, and we were especially excited to see how non-invasive imaging biomarkers could be leveraged to support individualised patient care." Read the paper HERE.
